

Safe Winter Walkways

Preparing snow routes for pedestrian traffic

WHO: Lawrence volunteers

WHAT: Volunteers will be matched with Lawrence residents who are unable to shovel snow.

WHEN: Applicants for assistance must register by Jan. 6, 2006. Volunteers are asked to commit to the snow season and shovel snow each snowfall.

WHY: Maintaining Safe Winter Walkways helps keep Lawrence a desirable place to live.



The community depends on residents to remove snow from public sidewalks. During the winter months, many Lawrence residents need to be able to safely use public sidewalks. Children walking to neighborhood schools, students walking to both campuses, employees going to work and families enjoying the fresh air require safe walkways free of snow.

Applicants must...	Volunteers will...
be unable to remove snow.	provide assistance to seniors or those with disabilities.
pre-register for the program prior to next snow fall.	be matched to an individual in need for the season.
register before January 6, 2006.	remove snow from the public sidewalk and a walkway or path from the front door to the street. Any snow removal beyond sidewalks and walkway to the street is of the volunteer's own accord and not a requirement.

provide snow shovel and salt or other substance.	provide snow removal services to the match throughout the winter season.
