Dear Mr. Woosley:

The Bureau of Traffic Engineering has considered locations eligible for federal-aid HSIP funding for fiscal years 2008 and 2009 (October 2007 through September 2009). The table below lists three projects, of which the city may select one. The amount of federal funding being offered for each project is listed also.

INTERSECTION	SCOPE	FUNDING
9 th & Avalon	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Construct left turn lanes on 9thRealign Avalon to address offset	\$600,000
19 th & Naismith	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Construct Roundabout	\$700,000
6 th & Iowa/McDonald Drive	<ul style="list-style-type: none">Construct Roundabout on McDonaldRestrict westbound left turn from 6th onto IowaDirect southbound traffic under 6th to merge into southbound Iowa	\$700,000

The project selected will be funded utilizing federal-aid HSIP funds, with a 90% federal/10% city split in funding. The funding offered is the maximum amount for the project. These funds will cover the costs of construction and construction engineering (inspection).

In addition to 10% of these costs, the city will be responsible for the following:

- Acquiring all necessary right-of-way in accordance with federal-aid procedures.
- Initiating all utility adjustments, both for the facilitation of construction and for the benefit of traffic safety.
- Preparing the project plans in accordance with KDOT standard specifications in English units.
- 100% of the costs exceeding the maximum amount of federal funds.

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If you have concerns about the scope of the project you select, please contact me so we can come to some understanding and agreement. Please inform me of the city's decision to accept or not accept a project by March 30, 2007. Once I am informed the city accepts the project, an engineer from this bureau will be assigned the project and will contact you to discuss project scheduling. Unfortunately, funding for the 2008 federal fiscal year is not available as those funds are being used to account for the federal projects we are currently involved in. The project selected must be let within the 2009 federal fiscal year (October 2008 through September 2009).
