Subject: Hazardous Parking on Jordan Lane

Dear Traffic Commissioner or To Whom it May Concern:

I own a resident at 2605 Jordan Lane and have some important safety issues with this area. Parking on both sides of the street is risky and could cause deadly consequences. Cars parked on both sides of this narrow and curvy street poses the following problems:

- 1. A large vehicle such as a fire truck or ambulance could not get through in case of an emergency, which lost minutes could mean a life.
- This is a residential area with families with young children often playing unsupervised.
 There is a high potential of one of them getting hit by a passing vehicle if they dart in between the cars parked on both sides of the street chasing a ball, etc.
- This is not a straight street; it has curves which complicates the matter and worsens the problem.
- 4. It's impossible to back out of your driveway with vehicles parked on both sides.


