Shall the following be adopted?

Shall a countywide retailers' sales tax in the amount of 1% be imposed by the Board of County Commissioners of Douglas County, Kansas, the revenue from which shall be received, pursuant to State law, by Douglas County, the City of Baldwin City, the City of Eudora, the City of Lawrence, and the City of Leocompton, and shall be used by Douglas County for general governmental purposes, including the issuance of sales tax revenue and general obligation bonds, and also including, but not limited to the following purposes:

- 1. The expansion and operation of the county jail, and attendant improvements and related costs;
2. The acquisition, construction and improvement of facilities for the Bert Nash Mental Health Center, the Douglas County Visiting Nurses Association, and the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department, and attendant improvements and costs; and
3. The reduction of ad valorem property tax levies as established and determined by Douglas County;

and pursuant to an interlocal agreement Douglas County and the City of Lawrence have agreed that the sales tax revenue shall be used by the City of Lawrence for general governmental purposes, including but not limited to the following purposes:

- 1. The development and operation of parks and recreation facilities and programs, including the acquisition of property, attendant improvements and related costs, pursuant to the City of Lawrence's adopted comprehensive plan for parks and recreation;
2. The acquisition, construction, and improvement of facilities for the Bert Nash Mental Health Center, the Douglas County Visiting Nurses Association, and the Lawrence-Douglas County Health Department, and attendant improvements and costs; and
3. The reduction of ad valorem property tax levies as established and determined by the City of Lawrence.

OFFICIAL QUESTION SUBMITTED U.S.D. NO. 497

Shall the following be adopted?

Shall Unified School District No. 497, Douglas County, State of Kansas (Lawrence), issue general obligation bonds in an amount not to exceed \$36,900,000, to pay the costs to make in the District the following improvements and all necessary appurtenances thereto: (a) acquire a site and construct, equip and furnish thereon a second high school for the District at a cost not to exceed \$25,800,000; (b) renovate, remodel, equip and otherwise improve New York, Woodlawn, Pinckney, Cordley, Deerfield and Schwagler Elementary Schools, West Junior High School and Lawrence High School; (c) construct improvements to and renovate athletic facilities at Lawrence High School, South Junior High School, West Junior High School, and on District land in Holcomb Park; (d) replace and make improvements to roofs at Hillcrest, Centennial and Broken Arrow Elementary Schools, Lawrence High School, South Junior High School and West Junior High School; and (e) construct, furnish and equip additions to existing structures consisting of the following: (1) gymnasium and library at New York Elementary School, (2) gymnasium at Wakarusa Elementary School, (3) library at Sunset Hill Elementary School, (4) library at Broken Arrow Elementary School, and (5) gymnasium at Woodlawn Elementary School, all pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 10-101 et seq., K.S.A. 25-2018 (f), K.S.A. 75-2315 et seq. and K.S.A. 72-6761?
