The mission of the Emergency Management Department is to protect the citizens and property in Wyandotte County from all emergencies or disasters. This is accomplished in part by the coordination of departments and activities of local government, state and federal agencies, private and volunteer organizations, citizens, businesses and adjacent jurisdictions in the mitigation of, preparedness for, response to, and recovery from natural and man-made emergency/disaster situations.

Important Issues:

- Replacement of countywide BPU/Public Safety Radio System.
- Renovation of Emergency Operations Center-Backup 911-New 311 Center
- Approval by all Public Safety departments and promulgation of the Local (County) Emergency
 Operations Plan (LEOP) by the Mayors and County Commissioners.
- Adoption of Resolution required by DHS adopting National Incident Management Plan.
- Implement-Train-Exercise Wyandotte County Emergency Operations Plan/ Standard Operations Guides
- Completion of required NIMS courses by all elected and appointed officials by October 1, 2007.
- Receive new Regional Communications Trailer / Maintain for Metro deployment- exercise Interoperability Plan and Procedures.
