

Request to Install Stop Signs at Traffic Booth Locations on the Main Campus of the University of Kansas, Lawrence, Kansas

The University of Kansas is currently working to improve campus signage for the purposes of improved safety, wayfinding for visitors, and traffic control.

As part of this process, the signage at the current traffic booths has been evaluated and found to be confusing with the volume of information posted. In an effort to safely enforce vehicular access to the core of the campus while providing pertinent information at the traffic booth locations, the University proposes to remove "stop" information from our campus information signs at these locations and make use of regulatory stop signs and painted stop bars on the pavement. All associated costs will be the responsibility of the University. Please refer to the attached exhibits for the following locations:

- 1. The west end of Jayhawk Boulevard for eastbound Jayhawk Boulevard traffic coming from the Chi Omega fountain traffic circle and entering the campus at the traffic control booth.
- 2. The north side of the Sunflower Road and Sunnyside Avenue intersection for northbound traffic entering the campus at the traffic control booth.
- 3. The south side of the Jayhawk Boulevard and 14th Street intersection for southbound Jayhawk Boulevard traffic entering the campus at the traffic control booth.
- 4. The south end of Mississippi Street near the intersection of Memorial Drive for southbound Mississippi Street traffic entering the campus at the traffic control booth.
