## News from the City

The Burlington Northern Santa Fe railroad (BNSF) has tentatively agreed to carry out some major plumbing repairs at the depot, including fixing an active leak that has been present for some time. The efforts of Assistant City Manager, *Diane Stoddard*, who is working with BNSF on the depot's deferred maintenance issues, are paying off. Thanks to *Richard Kershenbaum* for working with a local plumbing contractor to obtain bids for the repair work.

## **News from Amtrak**

Amtrak has signed an agreement with *Ms. Jan Butin*, East Lawrence neighborhood resident, for caretaker services Monday - Friday for the morning train (No. 4) at the Lawrence Amtrak depot. As caretaker, Jan opens the depot for passengers waiting to board the eastbound 5:49 AM train, as well as for families waiting to give rides to passengers arriving at in Lawrence. In addition to keeping passengers informed of train status, Jan will help to keep the depot clean. She locks the depot a half hour after the train departs.

Amtrak has authorized the hiring of a second Lawrence caretaker for the midnight train (No. 3). Applicants are currently being interviewed. Watch for an announcement in the next edition of this newsletter (January 2009). We are pleased that Amtrak is supporting passenger service in Lawrence in this way.

New Amtrak signage will be installed this winter on the depot platform. A large 7'x7' standing kiosk will identify the station, and will provide weather-proof space for display of train schedules and other information.
