Dear Lawrence City Commissioners:

Underage drinking is not a harmless rite of passage. It is illegal and dangerous. The New Tradition Coalition of Lawrence is committed to providing parents and the community with factual data, education and resources to reduce the incidence of underage drinking and related tragedies. Effective law enforcement is a proven strategy to reduce underage drinking.

During this legislative session, wording was updated in the alcohol and underage drinking social host law. (House bill 2165). The new version of the law will take effect July 1, 2009 in Kansas. Lawrence and other communities in the state will be required to update their local ordinances to reflect this change.

The New Tradition Coalition of Lawrence, consisting of individuals from law enforcement, substance abuse prevention, parents, community members and public health would like to encourage the commission when they undergo this update to consider strengthening the ordinance to assist our community in addressing and enforcing underage drinking laws.

Social host ordinances are a powerful law enforcement tool that allows officers to crack down on parties and gatherings where alcohol is served to minors. They hold a person (of any age) who allows underage drinking to occur, to be held criminally liable. In addition, fines collected help to offset law enforcement and prosecution expenses.

We recognize that underage drinking is a significant problem in Lawrence. As a college town, we have an extraordinary number of youth at risk. We urge you, our key leaders, to support strengthening our social hosting ordinance. By reinforcing our existing law, we will raise public awareness of the issue and build a stronger and safer community.
