<p>Project Description : The 1-day interactive workshop developed by the National Complete Streets Coalition would help about 30 key decision makers, stakeholders, elected officials, and City staff learn how to more effectively balance the needs of all users and routinely create and maintain "complete" streets. Led by 2 nationally-known design & policy experts, participants will learn: (1) Why Complete Streets are important; what they are – and are not; (2) The many avenues to Complete Streets; & (3) How Complete Streets can help achieve multiple transportation, health and community goals.</p>	
<p>What specific long-term changes do you expect your project to generate? This project is the next step in developing a Complete Streets policy, which would direct planners and engineers to consistently design with all users in mind. Complete Streets improve safety and encourage walking and bicycling.</p>	
<p>How will these changes be measured? A Complete Streets policy will establish performance standards with measureable outcomes. Changes will be measured based on how new road construction and major reconstruction projects accommodate all users.</p>	
<p>How will these changes be sustained after grant funds are expended? Planning, designing, and maintaining Complete Streets will be the responsibility of the City after a policy is adopted.</p>	
<p>What gives this project a high likelihood of success? A major obstacle in developing a Complete Streets policy is educating decision makers and crafting the policy to fit the goals of the community. This workshop will allow policy experts to lead that discussion with all the stakeholders involved.</p>
