Background:

The Wichita Area Chapter of Pink Heals/Guardians of the Ribbon, Inc. has requested (see attachment) that the decommissioned unit be donated to them to support their mission of promoting the "Cares to Wear Pink" campaign across the State of Kansas. The Guardians of the Ribbons wear pink and drive pink fire trucks across the county to honor and support all women - healthy ones and the ones in the fight for their lives. The pink fire engines are donated, and bring love and hope for the women in each city who desperately need support. The Guardians ask organizations like the police and fire departments in each city to set the example by wearing pink, and asks the local politicians and teachers along with the citizens of each community to join the efforts as a show of support for the women throughout the country.

Current Status:

Unit 629, a 1987 engine built by Pierce is scheduled to be decommissioned with the delivery of the new engine. Typically, we place decommissioned apparatus up for sale on GovDeals. Previously, we placed a truck similar to Unit 629 for sale on GovDeals, which sold for \$6,025. Additionally, a regional used truck dealer has estimated the value of Unit 629 to be \$6,000.

Request:

Instead of placing Unit 629 for sale of GovDeals, donat to Wichita Area Chapter of Pink Heals/Guardians of the Ribbon, Inc. as requested.
