While tenant occupancy in the LDCBA Bioscience and Technology Business Center (BTBC) has been filled at a successful rate during its first year of existence, any depletion of funding from any of our three sources would significantly hinder our ability to meet monthly obligations and fulfill the purposes for which the LDCBA was created.

A special task force of community leaders was constituted in 2006 to consider the economic development opportunities inherent in leveraging and promoting KU life science research and commercialization capabilities and attracting bioscience companies to Lawrence and Douglas County. As a result of the research and planning conducted by this Bioscience Task Force, the LDCBA was formed and funded.

The LDCBA was collaboratively created at that time by the City of Lawrence, Douglas County, KS the University of Kansas (KU) and the Lawrence Chamber of Commerce. Its primary purpose is to develop bioscience resources by providing an infrastructure of professional talent, modern facilities, specialized

equipment and capital around targeted core competencies currently emerging at KU and in the local private sector. The Lawrence business community, KU and all citizens of Douglas County are served by the initiative inasmuch as it will expand the tax base, create job opportunities, create wealth and provide business development. Until 2010, the only funding for the LDCBA came from capital contributions from the City of Lawrence, Douglas County and KU. Beginning in September, 2010 tenants began occupying the BTBC building resulting in rent revenues to help offset operating expenses. However, anticipated rent revenues are not sufficient to cover operating expenses of the BTBC building without the continued financial support of the original four partners.
