Community Development programs are available for low to moderate income homeowners. In order to participate, applicants must meet the following income guidelines, based on family size.

8+	\$75,550

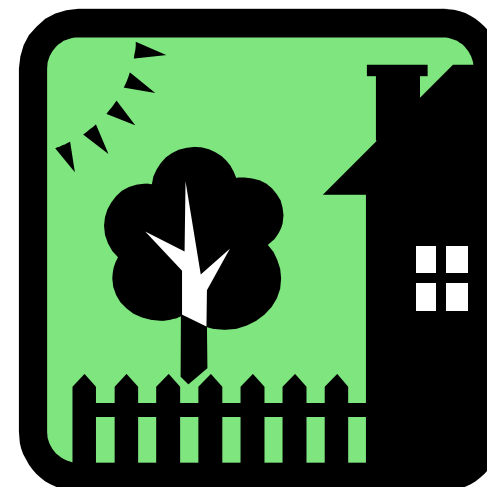

REHABILITATION

The Comprehensive Rehabilitation program is a loan program that allows homeowners to borrow up to \$25,000 to have necessary improvements completed. Work is performed by pre-qualified general contractors and may include the following:

Roofing, windows, paint, electrical, plumbing, flooring, foundation repairs, replacement of certain fixtures and appliances.



Participants in the program who are 62 and older, will make no monthly payments as long as they remain the owner-occupant. Other participants will make \$50 monthly payments. Up to 50% of these loans balances may be forgiven over a 7 year period.



The program has funding to complete approximately 10 projects a year, so it is not unusual for applicants to wait several months for the project to begin. Properties that have already participated in the program are ineligible.

LOAN PROGRAMS

For emergency situations, the city offers an Emergency Loan program that can provide up to \$5,000 for emergency repairs or furnace replacement. These loans have no monthly payments but are payable when the participant is no longer the owner-occupant of the property.



This the only program that is available for Mobile Homes. Mobile homeowners may access up to \$2,500 to make the necessary improvements.



WEATHERIZATION

The Weatherization program is a grant program for homeowners and does not need to be repaid. Work includes attic insulation, storm windows and weather-stripping of entry doors. Applications are accepted during the month of August each year, with the majority of work being finished by January. Properties that have participated in the program since January 1, 1993 are ineligible.
