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Dear Lawrence Public Library Art Selection Committee:

My goal is to create sculptural forms that capture the beauty and mystery of natural earth and astronomical formations utilizing glass, metal and light.

I am striving for work that relates to the chaos and pattern in nature as reflected in sea shore erosion, cloud and geological formation, fire, astronomical patterns, as well as wind and weather patterns. I am particularly interested in creating visual imagery that connects our primitive self to the awesomeness of our universe. I believe that the resulting work creates an unspoken language that we all relate to, but we can't express verbally; form, color, transparency, opacity, and depth.

The important unspoken meaning is that we recognize that integrity allows a community to see the way to what is right, to value all life and help everyone in society unlock their own potential. Everything we encounter, as we progress from infancy through adolescence and adult hood and finally as we approach our own death, has some unknown puzzle that can only be solved by immersing ourselves completely in life and be open to our fate. Despite our physical or cultural differences all people recognize beauty in art and nature and that all people have potential for inspiration.

My company carries two million dollars in general liability insurance. I have produced projects similar in scope to this proposal. I could meet all conditions and install my project on time and within budget.




A flurry of color and light climax in the 2-story atrium, where panels of art glass are suspended into a dynamic sculpture that suggests pages of a book that have been recast into new form and meaning.




Small art glass are subtley layered into the windows of the reading room areas to echo the pattern of the light slots in the walls/ceilings; these also act as lenses for viewers to peer through into the landscape.




Slivers of glass embedded into concrete sidewalk signal the theme of color and light at a pedestrian scale; the amount/intensity of glass increases the closer one gets to the front entrance.






Local artwork inside and outside the library will be accompanied by simple glass panels to identify the artist and provide a code for visitors to scan or call to acquire additional information on the piece.



A layer of multi-colored art glass illuminates the copper tracery of the parking garage screen, providing a visual pattern or text that challenges visitors to "read" space, surface, and material in a different way.




A climbable, sittable, and viewable fountain is envisioned near the plaza where vibrant art glass (with a protective layer) amalgamates into a punctuation point of the public space.


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
