

First Day of Residential Recycling Collection - October 21, 2014

The city's Solid Waste Division began recycling collection service for single-family and multi-family residences on Tuesday, October 21st. On this first day of service the city collected approximately 100,000 pounds (equivalent to 50 tons) of recyclable materials from residences in the Tuesday week #1 service area.

The city's outreach and education for the new residential recycling collection program continues as residents are reminded to check the cart lid for the list of recyclable materials accepted, to place their recyclable materials loosely in the cart (not bagged), and to set out their recycling cart at least 3 feet from other carts, mailboxes, parked cars, and any other items.
