Lawrence Cultural Arts Commission Grant Narrative

Project Vision

The Full Circle Mural Project will engage youth and their families living in the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority's Edgewood Homes in an artist-coordinated mural during the summer of 2015. The designated location for the murals will be on or near walls surrounding a dumpster enclosure near the Barbara Huppee Community Facility (located in Edgewood Homes). Full Circle staff has identified two professional, Lawrence-based mural artists, Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward, to coordinate this project. Amber and Nicholas will lead collaborative design sessions with residents to develop the mural's overall design and concept. In the final stages of the project, the mural will be painted by Full Circle youth and their families.

This project will provide the Edgewood Homes neighborhood with a community-organized mural, but more importantly inspire and encourage Full Circle youth to participate in larger community art and other community built environment projects. The summer is an excellent time to coordinate a mural project because school is out of session and youth have more time to become involved. By encouraging youth to participate, we also hope to recruit their families to take part in this project and have an active role in their community.

Target Audience

The Full Circle Mural Project will have a positive impact on all of the Edgewood residents (currently 303). The Full Circle Youth Program serves an average of 25 youth per day during the school year. The need for organized programming increases the summer and when school is out of session. Youth have more time and a relaxed schedule during the summer. Full Circle programming utilizes the summer to engage youth in specific educational and nurturing projects. Our program is unique in the sense that it is open to all youth who receive housing assistance through the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority (here on out referred to as LDCHA). All of our programming is free for families.

We anticipate 25 youth will take part in the mural design with a core group of 6 taking lead roles. This is in addition to an apprentice artist who will work directly with Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward.

Community Participation in the Arts

The purpose of the Full Circle Mural Project is first and foremost to engage Full Circle youth in a productive, educational, and collaborative arts project during the summer when school is not in-session. An added benefit is a participatory community beautification project.

Professional artists Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward in partnership with Full Circle staff will encourage resident involvement throughout the project. Amber and Nicholas both have experience organizing and developing community murals throughout the Midwest.

Youth who participate will be encouraged to take community based art classes (Lawrence Arts Center, Theatre Lawrence, etc). Full Circle will provide scholarships to overcome financial barriers.

Participants will gain an understanding of what it means to be a working-artist. They will learn various unseen components that make a public art project possible.

New Project

The proposed project is new to the Full Circle youth program. In the past, LDCHA has worked with community arts organizations and artists on a variety of programs and projects. The Full Circle Mural Project is unique due to the community collaboration component. This element will be a challenging component of the program, but it will also be the most fulfilling.

By encouraging community cooperation, we hope residents will have a sense of ownership and pride in their neighborhood. Community led murals provide the opportunity for neighborhood residents to create meaningful art while also engaging in community beautification. It is anticipated by LDCHA staff that the proposed mural project will be well received by residents (both participants and non-participants) because the mural will embody and represent the community.

Engagement Strategies

Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward will begin the project by hosting a neighborhood meeting for an overview of the project. Both artists are professional muralists specializing in community-led art. They have experience with coordinating and engaging neighborhoods in community art by presenting relevant information about the historical relevance and neighborhood impact of murals throughout history. During this introductory presentation, audience members will be invited to ask questions about the project. The artists will share specifics on how individuals can become involved in the project.

The community meetings will allow resident artists to ask questions regarding the process and explore opportunities to participate. More importantly, the facilitation process ensures that the facilitating artists, community members, and LDCHA staff share the same project expectations.

Information about the project and project meetings will be distributed to everyone receiving housings assistance through the LDCHA. Full Circle staff will also go door to door in the Edgewood neighborhood to discuss the project and how to residents can become involved. The staff has an ongoing and productive relationship with Edgewood residents and will utilize existing relationships promote and encourage participation. In addition, we will utilize professional artist expertise in how to engage community members for new and innovative ideas in community engagement.

Artist Collaboration

We have identified and connected with local professional muralists, Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward. Both artists have met with Full Circle staff to discuss the project and have seen the proposed mural site. Amber and Nicholas have written a project proposal and have agreed to these terms.

The Full Circle Youth Program benefits from working closely with the LDCHA Resident Services Office. This allows us to build relationships with families on a multi-generational level. The nature of these relationships leads to increased levels of program awareness.

Project Timeline

This project will take place over the USD 497 summer break. As part of the initial presentation, Full Circle Staff, artists, and residents will identify a three week continuous span that will allow as many people to participate as possible.

As outlined in the memo from Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward we will work off of the following timeline:

During the first week, the muralists will give an open public presentation at the center. The presentation will include general information about murals and their impact on communities now and throughout history. This introductory process provides a forum for residents to ask questions and to learn about how they can become involved in the project. This session will also serve to insure that the facilitating artists and community members share the same project expectations. (1hr.)

Within this project, there will also be a position available for an apprentice artist. This would be a person, possibly a youth who would like to be more engaged in the project. A small amount of budgeted project money (\$100.00) will be set aside for the apprentice positions. This position will offer the opportunity to work closely with professional artists and to gain a greater working knowledge about the process of designing and creating murals.

The lead artists will facilitate three different design sessions with residents. This self-selected group that decides to attend the design sessions will be the "design team." The three design sessions will result in the generation of broad concepts, specific themes and imagery for designs of the two murals. During these meetings, participants will be asked to share stories, to draw and to brainstorm ideas that will ultimately be incorporated into the final designs of the murals. (Each design session will last 1.5 – 2hrs. with a total of 3 design sessions during the week.)

The following week (week 2), the lead artists and apprentice will be working on location to create linear and color designs for the murals. These designs will rely upon the ideas and imagery generated during the first-week's design sessions. Once completed, the finished, composed designs will be presented to the design team and staff for approval. Once the designs have been approved painting can begin!

During the third week we will begin the painting process. The first day of painting will be a celebration and residents will be invited to participate. For the event we could have a cookout, play games etc... After that first day of painting and for the remainder of the week the lead artists and apprentice will continue to develop and finalize the murals. Both murals will be completed by the end of the third week.

Amber Hansen's Biography

Amber Hansen holds a MFA in drawing and painting from the University of Kansas and a BFA in painting and drawing from the University of South Dakota. From (2010 – 2012) she held the esteemed position of *Artist in Residence* at the University of Kansas where she taught life-drawing and mentored resident students. Hansen actively exhibits in the mediums of film, drawing, and musical performance and has been the lead artist in many public murals located throughout the Midwest. She was the lead assistant to artist David Loewenstein in community based murals projects in Tonkawa, Oklahoma, (2010), Joplin Missouri, (2011) and Hastings Nebraska (2013).

Most recently, Hansen was an artist in residence at HUB-BUB in Spartanburg, SC where she created new works with the community there. She is the co-director and editor of a soon to be released documentary film about creating community based murals in the mid-west titled, "Called to Walls", that is scheduled to be released in 2015.

Nicholas Ward's Biography

Nicholas Ward is a filmmaker, poet and painter based in Lawrence, KS. He has studied at the KID Puppet for Film Animation School in Prague, CZ with traditional puppet-makers and master stop-motion animators. In 2011, Nicholas was an artist in residence at Bemis Center for Contemporary Art in Omaha, NE. Nicholas has worked on several community mural projects throughout the mid-west and has been the assistant to muralist David Loewenstein on Mid-America Arts Alliance's community-based mural project in Tonkawa, OK (2012). Since 2012 Nicholas has been the director of photography and co-producer for the documentary film Called to Walls. He has instructed courses in drawing at the University of Kansas and youth courses in drawing and animation at the Lawrence Arts Center and the Missouri Fine Arts Academy. Nicholas received his BFA from the University of South Dakota in 2007 and his MFA from the University of Kansas in 2010.

Professional Mural artists, Amber Hansen and Nicholas Ward will be working with residents/youth at the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority's Full Circle Youth Program to create two new and original murals that will adorn the facades of selected dumpster-court walls at the facility. The concept and themes of these murals will be developed in collaboration with neighborhood residents during muralist lead design sessions. In these design-sessions residents will have the opportunity to contribute to the mural's overall design and concept. In the final stages of the project, residents will also be invited to collaborate on the initial painting of the murals.

During the first week, the muralists will give an open public presentation at the center. The presentation will include general information about murals and their impact on communities now and throughout history. This introductory process provides a forum for residents to ask questions and to learn about how they can become involved in the project. This session will also serve to insure that the facilitating artists and community members share the same project expectations. (1hr.)

Within this project, there will also be a position available for an apprentice artist. This would be a person, possibly a youth who would like to be more engaged in the project. A small amount of budgeted project money (\$100.00) will be set aside for the apprentice positions.
