 Subject: 2015 Sales Tax Distributions

The City of Lawrence has recently received its July sales tax and its share of County sales tax distribution. The distribution is the result of retail sales from mid-March to mid-April. The distribution of \$2,882,846 is \$37,231 more than the prior year distribution for the same month. It also includes \$8,501 from the Free State Transportation Development District (TDD), \$11,627 from the Oread TDD and \$460 for the 9th & New Hampshire TDD. The distribution also includes other amounts that will be paid to the Oread Tax Increment Financing District.

A summary of the latest city sales/use tax distribution is shown in the table below.




The year-to-date sales tax receipts started the year on a high note with well above average receipts for holiday sales in 2014 collected by the City in January and February of 2015. However, since the first of the year the sales tax collections for February through July are only slightly higher than prior year collections.

The 2015 revised budget reflects a total increase of 5% over 2014 actuals. At the end of July, we are at 4.8% year-to-date over 2014 and our 5% revised budget doesn't appear as conservative as we once thought. Staff will continue to monitor sales and recommend adjustments to budget if it appears projections through 2015 continue to drop below the 5% revised budget amount for the year.

The first graph on the following page shows the history of total sales and uses tax by year and a total \$25.9 million projected in 2015 for total sales and use tax based on the 5% estimate.

The second graph is a month-to-month graph showing the increases from prior year for each month.
