For some time, the City of Lawrence has been working, along with its economic development partners the Chamber/EDC and Douglas County, with Menard, Inc. regarding a possible manufacturing facility at Lawrence VenturePark. It is exciting to see this potential project move to the formal steps.

New business parks are often challenged with securing the first tenant. This can particularly be true in the case of a brownfield redeveloped property. That is why the prospect of having such a large initial project and a respected and recognizable company express interest in establishing a manufacturing facility at Lawrence VenturePark is so exciting. The City of Lawrence has invested substantially in restoring the former Farmland property to a productive use- land that would generate property tax base and primary jobs for Lawrence and Douglas County. 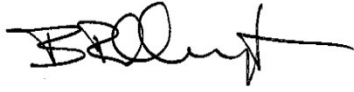
On behalf of the Economic Development Corporation of Lawrence & Douglas County and our development partners, I am submitting to you this letter of support for Midwest Manufacturing Inc., a wholly owned subsidiary of Menard Inc., also known as Project JT. Menard, Inc., the third largest home improvement store chain in the United States by sales volume will locate their product manufacturing facility in Lawrence VenturePark. Since February 2014 our community, through its partnerships with the Kansas Department of Commerce (KDOC), Kansas City Area Development Council (KCADC), Burlington-Northern Santa Fe Railroad and Menard Inc., has been engaged in a thorough and diligent process to determine the best possible location to expand Midwest Manufacturing's operations into the Kansas City metropolitan area. Other locations under consideration include two other Kansas locations and several in Missouri.
