Kathy started with the City of Lawrence Solid Waste Division in 2002 as a Waste Reduction / Recycling Specialist, with a focus area on household hazardous waste. She served over six years as a Waste Reduction / Recycling Operations Supervisor, and five years as a specialist. Today, she is the Solid Waste Division Manager of a municipal service that provides exclusive collection of residential and commercial trash in a community over 90,000 people. Kathy was appointed the Solid Waste Division Manager in November 2013. Some of the notable achievements and contributions in that time include:

- Construction of a new Household Hazardous Waste Facility opened in April 2016.
- Implementation of city-wide residential curbside recycling in October 2014.
- Containerization of trash (moving to mandatory carts to improve worker safety) in November 2012.
- Implementation of a 3 tiered variable rate structure for residential trash and changed collection days for approximately 20 percent of the community for the first time in 20 years.
- Annual programs managed by Kathy for this community include composting operations, hazardous waste disposal for households and businesses, electronics recycling, and Earth Day Parade and Celebration.



- City representative on the Douglas / Jefferson County Regional Solid Waste Management Committee since 2010.
- Drafted an RFP for a vendor for City-wide recycling. Kathy also completed the proposal for the City of Lawrence to be the curbside recycling vendor, which was ultimately selected.
- Member of the Executive Board for the Kansas Sunflower Chapter of SWANA since 2011.
