With these words gave <u>Eutin</u> citizens chief Dieter Holst yesterday the German-American Friendship Garden at the Heinrich Lüth-way - still behind the fence of the Landesgartenschau. He will remain there permanently.

At approximately 40 square meters are Osagedorn trees, sunflowers and a variety of prairie grasses, all plants from <u>Kansas</u>. Some of these grasses have it in their garden, said said <u>Kelly Scholz</u>. The are not so well advanced as far in Eutin, she must have a word with the Eutin gardeners. Kelly Scholz took the Partnership Advisory town Lawrence and the local twinning association, together with the Mayor's representative Mike Dever they represented the university town of Lawrence.

Next took ten students and six students participated with their teachers, who are currently in Eutin, at the ceremony as well as the US Consul Michael Gray (Hamburg) and the Dean of the Music Faculty in Lawrence, Bob Walzel.
