## Commissioners:

I note that the University of Kansas has agreed to provide more than half of the match required to obtain a KDOT grant for an airport improvement project that would presumably benefit a few key people in the campus community.

I further note that the university is not expected to participate in a match for another KDOT grant which would primarily and significantly benefit the campus community: the proposed ped-bike tunnel at 19th and lowa streets. The project is described on page 9 of KU's 2014 master plan as follows:

"19th and Iowa Gateway: A proposed mixed-use development for upper-level and graduate students will include housing, student amenities, and retail. An accessible path connects the Central and West Districts <u>bridging Iowa Street</u> as an extension of the proposed Jayhawk Trail." (emphasis added.)

In the three years since the KU master plan was published, why has city staff not aggressively pursued a funding partnership with the university for this project? The university has reportedly raised \$350 million for the Central District redevelopment. A contribution to the match required for the tunnel would be a small drop in the bucket for KU.
