Narrative: Beginning January 1, 2017, the Homeless Outreach Program is operating with only 2 outreach workers. This reduction is straining the ability of the outreach team to provide quality services. As the outreach team served a total of 429 clients, 233 of who were new in the 2016 year, which is consistent with years past, for the 2017 year each outreach worker can expect a case load of over 200 individuals. Downturns in services can also be expected to result in higher ER and emergency service utilization, and greater contact with police by those experiencing homelessness, and poses a possible increase in safety

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issues for those who are homeless and the greater Lawrence community as the availability of shelter and assistance with medical and other health related issues will be less available. Nevertheless, the program helped to house 19 individuals and 1 family in the first quarter of 2017, and served a total of 112 individuals and families. Major issues noted by team members continue to be insufficient service providers or insufficiently funded services, insufficient funds for housing, and insufficient availability of affordable housing.
