Kansas has a rich African American heritage, but there is a lack of public awareness about important events that shaped and defined the history and culture. From "Bleeding Kansas" anti-slavery wars to Brown vs. Board of Education, Kansas links political, social, racial, and cultural issues that continue to define and shape the social landscape.

Currently there is no formal collaboration between the historic sites and cultural organizations interpreting Kansas African American history and culture. The creation of the state-wide partnership to establish and promote the history trail will create a sustainable framework for institutional cooperation providing structure for regular meetings and fostering new initiatives, support and encouragement.



The U.S. Supreme Court decision in Brown v. Board of Education

(1954) is one of the most

otal opinions ever rendered by that body. This landmark decision highlights the U.S. Supreme Court's role in affecting changes in national and social policy. Often when people think of the case, they remember a little girl whose parents sued so that she could attend an all-white school in her neighborhood. In reality, the story of Brown v. Board of Education is far more complex.

In December, 1952, the U.S. Supreme Court had on its docket cases from Kansas, Delaware, the District of Columbia, South Carolina, and Virginia, all of which challenged the constitutionality of racial segregation in public schools. They decided to put Brown first "so that the whole question would smack of being a purely Southern one."
