#### Definitions

- •Adequate care, adequate food, adequate water, adequate shelter, adequate health care
- Enforcement officer
- •Owner
- Vicious/Dangerous animals

#### Penalty Section

1 section up front
Creates different penalties for different sections



Animals Excluded from prohibition
Added a number of animals based upon H.S. recommendations
Grandfather provision for cat limit
Additional discussion on prohibited vs. permitted



#### Cruelty to Animals

- Updated based upon best practices
  Added a new crime of "depiction of animal cruelty"
- •Added a requirement that landlords contact an Enforcement Officer within 24 hours to report animals abandoned in a rental property.

#### Animal Nuisances

- •Odor
- Noise
- Property damage
- Animals in heat
- Animal that injures another animal



#### Dangerous Animals

•Any animal which has caused a bite injury or killed another dog or cat, equine, or livestock

•Adds requirements for keeping the animal after adjudication, including leash and muzzle, confinement indoors, "dangerous animal" signs, training classes, spaying/neutering, and possible insurance requirement.



#### Vicious Animals

•Any animal which has caused great bodily harm, disfigurement, or death to any person.

•Does not include an animal that has caused great bodily harm to any person while a person was committing a criminal offense, or willfully trespassing on the property of the owner of the animal.



#### **Reckless pet owner**

- Replaces the current habitual violator section
- 4 or more violations within 36 months
- Can include a prohibition on pet ownership
