Mary welcomed all attendees to the meeting. She then introduced Kristen Channel, the speaker for the day:

<u>Project Lively</u> – a program to help someone who has a disorder, or who wanders. Program was started in 1999 in Virginia. In 2010 Douglas County adopted the program. The Pilot Club backed the effort and helps with fundraising.

- There are currently 7 clients ranging in age from 12-81. The Program is for the entire county of Douglas.
- The client can live in a single residence or a CLO house. They may have autism or a traumatic brain injury.
- If we have to search for someone, it could take hours or days. With Project Lifesaver, we can find them very quickly usually 30 minutes or less. The program is designed for people who walk not have access to a car.

<u>Equipment</u> – transmitter – like a watch to be worn on wrist or ankle. It is waterproof.

- Once a month, the batteries are changed in the transmitter.
- Each transmitter is programed to a different radio frequency with range or 7-10 miles.
- Search specialists are trained and certified. Currently a team is certified.

<u>Enrollment</u> – Call Kristen who will meet with the family of the client who has tendency to wander.

- A bio of the person is completed including habits, previous addresses, favorite places to go (ex. Dairy Queen or McDonalds).
- Charge for a transmitter is \$300 for 1 year, then \$10/month. Includes bands and batteries.
- The receivers cost \$1500 and there must be 3 of them available to triangulate the signal.
- The Alzheimer's Assn has scholarship money available.
- The client's caregiver checks the battery daily.

- Create a safety profile for you and your household can include photos
- Register all phone numbers in the household. Code for the door (location hidden key)
- Include: house floor plans, utility shutoff, pet information, children and schools
- Every 6 months a reminder email is sent to have information confirmed.
