Stay Informed:

How to find out about projects in your neighborhood and stay connected to your city.

The City of Lawrence is committed to keeping residents, businesses, neighborhoods, and anyone interested in Lawrence city government informed. Below is a listing of various methods and the types of information available.

E-mail

The City of Lawrence offers multiple e-mail distribution lists; anyone can sign up for our e-mail lists. Go to www.lawrenceks.org/subscriptions, enter your e-mail address, and check the type of subscriptions you'd like to receive. This one-stop subscriptions page allows you to sign up for any of the items listed below:

Agendas – City Commission, Planning Commission, Board of Zoning Appeals, Historic Resources Commission, Traffic Safety Commission, Community Commission on Homelessness and the Community Development Advisory Boards. You will receive an agenda or agenda updates prior to scheduled meetings.

City News – Keep informed of city news by signing up for city news releases. You can also select to receive information about the public transit/bus system (including re-routes). We also offer e-mail lists exclusively designed to keep Property Managers and Landlords informed and a Reduce, Reuse, Recycle list for environmentally conscious citizens.

Neighborhood News – You can sign up for e-mail information specific to the area of town in which you live. We offer four e-mail lists that focus on specific sections of the city: Northeast Quadrant (north of 15th Street and east of Iowa Street), Northwest Quadrant (north of Bob Billings Parkway and west of Iowa Street), Southeast Quadrant (south of 15th Street and east of Iowa Street), and Southwest Quadrant (south of Bob Billings Parkway and west of Iowa Street).

Planning, Development and Construction News – You can sign up to receive e-mails from the Lawrence Douglas County Planning Office each week that outlines submitted projects. If you're a contractor, we have an e-mail list designed just to provide information to contractors related to city-specific information. The Lawrence Douglas County Metropolitan Planning Office also offers an e-mail distribution list for transportation-related projects that affect the community.

Public Meetings – The city offers a distribution list for anyone wanting to receive information on various public meetings that are held by the city. The list changes periodically but you can view it online at www.lawrenceks.org/subscriptions to see if there is a topic you're interested in.

Recreation – The Parks and Recreation Department maintains lists related to aquatics, Eagle Bend Golf Course, family and kids programs, Prairie Park Nature Center, and indoor and outdoor playing conditions.

City Jobs – You can receive e-mail postings each time the City of Lawrence posts an opening by visiting www.lawrenceks.org/subscriptions.

Channel 25

Lawrence's City Government Access Channel, Channel 25, contains information about city services and upcoming city events. The City Commission Agenda is posted here each week. Channel 25 is available to subscribers of Sunflower Broadband's cable service. The City Commission meetings air on Channel 25 at 6:35 p.m. on Tuesdays (except for when meetings are cancelled).

Online

City Website - The city's website, www.lawrenceks.org is an excellent resource for residents for information about current events, city programs, projects and departmental contact information. A section has been built just for Residents (<http://www.lawrenceks.org/residents>) that links to the most widely used forms and frequently asked questions (FAQ). A searchable database of FAQs is available online at <http://web.ci.lawrence.ks.us/faq> to get answers to some of the most asked questions received through our departments.

The Flame - The City of Lawrence utilizes a monthly newsletter, *The Flame*, to promote major events and educate citizens about city services, programs and pertinent information. The Flame is mailed to residents along with the monthly Utility Bills.

Neighborhood Updates – The Development Services division produces a monthly update for the Lawrence Association of Neighborhoods (LAN).
