addendum Parachute lease

I hope to be a the meeting next Wed 4 Oct 2017 6:30 pm, but I may still be out of town.

In the event that I am not at the meeting, here are my comments on the 2 drafts. I would appreciate if my comments would be added to the record in the event that I am unable to attend.

- 1) Minimum Standards
 - a. Page 10. Top box, last bullet item.
 - i. As in the draft
 - 1. The applicant does not comply with the terms of their lease agreement or with these Minimum Standards for parachute operations as set forth herein.
 - ii. This section discussed General requirements. Should this read
 - 1. The applicant does not comply with the terms of their lease agreement or with these Minimum Standards as set forth herein.
 - b. Page 35. Parachute Operations.
 - i. Qualifications should be specified for the Drop Zone Manager
 - 1. The term "drop zone manager/observer" should be changed to "drop zone manager"
 - a. This is a key and very responsible position that impacts the safety of the operation in a busy airport environment.
 - b. By including the word "observer" in the description, this implies that this is not a key safety related position which and all that this person needs to do is observe.
 - ii. Standard Operation Procedures (SOP).
 - 1. No requirement that the parachute operator be required to establish a set of standard operating procedures.
 - A parachute activity will significantly affect other operators at the airport, and the safety of the operations of these other operators at the airport.
 - 3. A set of detail SOP's should be a requirement of the parachute operator to establish, publish and adhere to.
 - a. The draft "POLICIES and PROCEDURES FOR PARACHUTE OPERATIONS" along with Section I of the minimum standards is an outline for the basis of minimums that must be met.
 - Other operators at the airport that conduct safety related operations are required to establish a set of SOP's (reference page 14 third bullet item re FBO requirement to establish SOP's for fueling)

2) POLICIES and PROCEDURES FOR PARACHUTE OPERATIONS

- a. Item 8, properly escorted I believe should be explicitly defined.
 - i. Recommendations are that as a minimum the escort should
 - 1. Have a radio capable of communicating on the Unicom frequency
 - 2. Be properly licensed by the FCC to operate that radio
 - 3. Be a licensed pilot familiar with the Lawrence airport and operations thereon
 - 4. Have participated in the daily briefing as required under paragraph 14.
 - 5. Have available a cell phone in their possession
 - 6. Maintain communication with the drop zone manager/observer

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
