Judy welcomed all attendees to the meeting. She then introduced Laura and Darcey, speakers for the day:

Darcey Laterno- Care Consultant provided us with some key facts about Alzheimer's.

- Alzheimer's is the most common type of dementia. One in 80 age 65 and older will have it.
- Of women in that age group, 2/3 will have dementia.
- The disease is progressive and fatal. However, one can live up to 20 years with Alzheimer's.
- There are 5.8 million people with Alzheimer's; by 2050 that number will grow to 14 million.
- Every 65 seconds, someone develops it and one in three will die with Alzheimer's.
- Alzheimer's is the 6th leading cause of death in the US.
- By 2019, the cost will be \$290 billion; by 2050 cost will rise to \$1.1 trillion.
- 16 million people provide unpaid care. 18.5 billion hours valued at \$234 Billion.

The local Alzheimer's office is located in Prairie Village and serves 66 counties in KS and MO. Satellite offices are located in Topeka, Pittsburgh, and St Joseph.

Signs and symptoms of Alzheimer's onset:

- Memory loss that is disrupting to daily life.
- Challenges in planning and solving problems.
- Difficulty in completing familiar tasks
- Trouble understanding visual and spatial cues.
- New problems with words speaking & writing.

Alzheimer's offices have services to help at NO COST.

- Family support best to phone first.
- Resource library in each office.
- Websites have many videos available.
- Support groups early stage and caregivers.
- 24 house support line.

- Misplacing things, can't retrace steps.Decreasing understanding; poor judgements.
- Withdrawing at work and from social activities.
- Changes in mood or personality.
- Education and training
- Legal, education, teleconferencing programs
- Online training videos.
- Awareness research and public policy.

<u>Laura Blatter</u> - Walk to End Alzheimer's – September 29th in Lawrence at South Park. About a mile. Opportunity to fund raise by creating a team for the walk. June 21st – Longest day – create your own event. Rivals – Women's Football team – mid October

<u>Judy Bellome – AARP -</u>state and national actions – Drug prices are the biggest issue with bills in the US house and senate. Allowing Medicare to negotiate prices. Putting cap on out of pocket costs. Judy also met with the Secretary of the Department of Children and Aging. Surveys are being done to make sure care-givers information is asked for at the hospitals.
