

2015 Social Service Funding Application – Non-Alcohol Funds

Applications for 2015 funding must be complete and submitted electronically to the City Manager's Office at ctoomay@lawrenceks.org by 5:00 pm on Friday, May 2, 2014. Applications received after the deadline **will not** be reviewed by the Social Service Funding Advisory Board.

General Information: Each year, the City Commission considers requests for the allocation of dollars to a number of agencies that provide services benefiting the Lawrence community. These funds are to be used to support activities that align with the Community Health Plan which was developed with input from many people throughout the community. The five areas for the plan are listed below:

- Access to healthy foods
- Access to health services
- Mental heath
- Physical activity
- Poverty and jobs

Applications will be reviewed by the Social Service Funding Advisory Board at meetings held from 8:00 a.m. to 12:00 p.m. on May 23 and May 30. **Applicants are asked to make a contact person available by phone at that time in case questions arise.**

Following their review, the Advisory Board will forward recommendations for funding to the City Commission. Recommendations will be based upon the following criteria:

- availability of city funds
- the stated objectives of the applicant's program
- alignment of the program with the Community Health Plan
- the efforts to collaborate and create a seamless system of support for residents
- outcomes that move program participants from total dependency toward measurable levels of independence
- ability to measure progress toward the program objectives and the Community Health Plan
- past performance by the agency in adhering to funding guidelines (as appropriate)

The final decision regarding funding will be made by the City Commission when they adopt the Annual Operating and Capital Improvement Budget in August.

Please note that funds will be disbursed according to the following schedule unless otherwise agreed to in writing:

- First half of funds will not be disbursed before April 1
- Second half of funds will not be disbursed before October 1

The Ecumenical Fellowship will not duplicate any efforts for The MLK Community Activities, but will bring others together in changing the culture and carrying out the memorial events. We will teamwork with others in the community such as the Boys and Girls Club, The Lawrence Community Shelter, USD 497 and other community agencies as we coordinate programs and services for the health of the community.

SECTION 6. PROGRAM OBJECTIVES

Please provide three specific program objectives for 2015. - 1. Provide Scholarship Awards to assist in furthering education, allowing us to give a minimum of 2 significant scholarship awards.
- 2. Conduct a Business Bazaar to educate the community of local goods and services available including health screening/maintenance and prevention of hypertension, diabetes, and other life threatening diseases.
- 3. Work with the Boys & Girls Club to prepare Scholarship applicants and educate students on requirements for receiving scholarships. Services to be provided to approximately 60 clients.
- 4. Provide educational opportunity for Youths be exposed to a wealth of information captured in the Memphis Civil Rights Museum and Washington DC Monument honoring Dr. Martin Luther King.
- 5. Provide social camp events; exposing at least 5 children per summer to activities and people in their peer groups, sharpening their interpersonal skills; resulting in quality decisions for making better life choices.
- 6. Network with the University of Kansas and Haskell University. The results will be better race relations impacting over 40% of the Lawrence Community.
- 7. Continue the work with the Jayhawk Rotary Club event bringing multicultural and multiracial groups together for a motivational breakfast greatly impacting the community with increasing participation each year.

- 8. Provide a musical concert, which honors the legacy of Dr. King in words and music, featuring a diverse group of youth and adult choir members.
- 9. Continue as an active member of the USD 497 strategic planning MLK committee for developing school programs for maximizing community support.
