Summary

Wicked Broadband has developed a plan to provide last-mile fiber to the premises (FTTP) services for the entire community in a way that promotes competition and facilitates public access.

The most important component of Wicked's proposal is that the company will operate the resulting infrastructure as a wholesale common carriage system. All retailers in the community would be granted access to the system at a pre-agreed, publicly published wholesale price.

These services will be provided in a competitively neutral manner. Any and all service providers will be welcome to use the resulting infrastructure to provide competitive telecommunications services to the community.

This community oriented approach provides a level playing field where providers will compete to provide services to residents. Using this approach, everyone wins;

- **Residents** get access to a competitive marketplace where providers compete to provide the best quality service at the lowest price.
- **Providers** share capital costs and gain access to future proof fiber-optic infrastructure. This reduces their overhead and allows them to deploy next generation services to residents.
- Local government gets access to a growing revenue stream in the form of expanded franchise fee payments. All users of the network would be required to pay a 5% franchise fee on their gross Internet revenue.

The project, which is already under way, takes place in three phases:

1. **Pilot project** – the pilot project will provide service to around 1,000 homes in the neighborhoods selected during company's pre-registration contest. Four (4) fibers will be pulled and terminated at each customer's residence. Once funded, the total calendar time for this project is expected to be 9 to 12 months.




Figure 1: Neighborhoods self selected for Phase I pilot project

2. Equity Expansion – in 2015 and 2016 the company will pursue an equity investment on the order of \$10M to expand the pilot project to an additional 10,000 homes. This expansion is expected to take two years to implement.




Figure 2: Phase II will bring fiber to another 10,000 homes

3. **Debt Expansion** – As part of the equity round, the company will secure follow-on funding to complete the network. This funding will likely take the form of \$20M in bonds or other long term debt obligation. This phase is also expected to take two years to implement. At the end of this project, Lawrence will have fiber installed or available to all of the households in the community.




Figure 3: Phase III will provide complete coverage.

Under this model the private sector provides 98% of the \$30M needed to build a FTTP network in the community. The City of Lawrence "primes the pump" by participating in the pilot project and enthusiastically supporting the build out effort. Momentum from the successful pilot project is used to raise private equity for network expansion. During the final phase, revenue generated from subscriptions to the first two phases is used to secure debt financing for the final build out.

In exchange for its financial support (\$500K of the \$1M needed during the pilot phase), the City receives concessions on how the network is operated:

- 1. The network owner will be required to provide access to the network to any and all service providers on an equal basis. Pricing for wholesale access will be publicly available and all providers will be treated equally.
- 2. The City will receive 5% of the gross retail revenue from all services operated on the network system. This includes television, telephone and, most importantly, Internet revenues. It is important to note that currently the City of Lawrence does not receive franchise revenue from the Internet services provided on incumbent networks.
- 3. Wicked Broadband will deploy a WiFi network in conjunction with the fiber-optic role-out. This network will allow anyone to access City of Lawrence, Douglas County, USD497 or University of Kansas network resources without a paid account. This means that all citizens will have access to local government resources from any WiFi enabled device.

It should be noted that there is not a single example of a fiber-optic system being deployed inside or outside the United States without extensive support from the municipality. In many cases this support takes the form of an exclusive franchise (as was the case with Sunflower Broadband and AT&T).

Even Google Fiber required extensive in-kind subsidies from Kansas City in the form of free office space, access to existing fiber-optic cable and discounted pole attachments. Of these subsidies, discounted pole attachments and expedited engineering were the single largest subsidy.

Since Lawrence does not own its utility infrastructure, the City's ability to provide in-kind subsidies is limited, so there will have to be some kind of financial subsidy to make any project feasible.

Any provider who proposes the construction of a system without substantial subsidies of some kind is destined for failure. This is especially true of providers who have little or no experience actually operating an Internet Service Provider.

Services & Pricing

Much like Google Fiber, Wicked Broadband will provide both Television and Internet service to fiber optic customers. The company will also continue to provide wireless services for WiFi enabled devices.

Television Services

Wicked Broadband has entered into an agreement to provide television services to Lawrence. The company is in the process of launching its first TV product which is expected to debut in June of 2014.

A complete lineup of channels appears in Appendix A. At some future juncture Wicked plans to expand its TV service to include premium channels such as HBO, Showtime and Starz.

Internet Services

Wicked Broadband already provides services to many residents of Lawrence, KS including 1 gigabit per second (Gbps) fiber optic service. That is 100x faster than the service available at the average American home. Wicked provides this service to a variety of single family, multi family and business addresses.

Exempt Service

Wicked Broadband is proud to provide free service to hundreds of low income residents at dozens of sites throughout the community. All non-profit organizations in our community qualify for free service from the company¹. This service includes free installation, free Internet service and free maintenance.

Sites that qualify for exempt services are connected via the best technology available at the site. As the company expands its fiber presence, these organizations and individuals will be upgraded to 1 Gpbs fiber-optic service.

Table 1: Wicked provides free service to local charities and to individual low income households.



As part of this project, service will be extended to the Lawrence Art Center and the Habitat Restore facility as well as any other charitable or government organizations.

Residential Service

Wicked Broadband provides service to residential homes using a variety of technologies. Homes served under this FTTP initiative will be offered the option of subscribing via fiber-optic cable, but will also be able to access service via the accompanying WiFi network if they so choose.

Wicked's residential service has no bandwidth caps. The company also provides 24x7 status monitoring for equipment providing service to single family homes via fiber. Often times, the company knows about outages or equipment failures before the home owner. This allows the company to contact the home owner and dispatch a technician without being prompted.


Finally, the company's service is "reflective" meaning that most Wicked members get download speeds that are equal to their upload speeds. This makes Wicked's service unique in the community and provides its subscribers with orders of magnitude better connectivity when uploading large files or engaging in video conferencing.

Bulk Service

The company has offered bulk rate service to other retailers and to the community at large for over five years. This service allows competitors or large customers to purchase accounts for multiple addresses and pay a single, heavily discounted invoice.

The company currently provides bulk service to over 3,000 Lawrence residents at apartment complexes and greek houses throughout the community.

Business Service

Wicked's business service is second to none. The company provides managed connectivity and 24x7 monitoring to its business clients. Businesses have access to mobile phone contact information for the

company's management and if they experience problems, they can get an expert on the phone in minutes.

The company's business services are also "reflective" meaning that business customer's upload speeds are identical to their download speeds. This allows businesses to push documents, images, videos and other large data files to the Internet several times faster than competing technologies.

Wicked's business service is also priced differently than other providers. The company guarantees one Mbps of throughput for each \$59.98/month paid. With each dedicated Mbps of service, the company provides an additional 9 Mbps of best effort service. That means that businesses are guaranteed to have a certain level of connectivity, but a vast majority of the time they receive 10x more throughput than they are pay for.

Delivery Technologies

Clients accessing the network on fiber generally achieve the full advertised rate.

It is important to note, however, that the quality of the company's wireless connectivity is dependent on a host of factors including the quality of the client's device, antenna type, line of site (i.e. walls, obstructions, tree coverage), background noise and proximity.

Though most clients get substantially more throughput than they pay for, certain clients are unable to achieve the full speeds offered by the company. These clients are distant from an antenna, have obstructions between their device and the antenna or are located in an area with a high level of background noise.

Community Wireless Communications, Co. DBA Wicked Broadband has been providing service to residents of Lawrence since its founding in January 2006. The company has developed and implemented the largest open-source mesh network in the United States.

The company currently acts as the primary Internet service provider for thousands of residents here in Lawrence, KS. Wicked currently offers the fastest service available in Lawrence – 1,000 Mbps full duplex service delivered on active fiber. This service is on-par with services provided by Google Fiber and substantially exceeds the speed of services publicly offered by incumbent providers.




Figure 4: Speedtest.net speedtest for residential Gigabit customer.

Wicked's staff includes network professionals with over a decade of experience in building and maintaining high speed networks. In addition to industry standard certifications like A+, Network+ and Security+, Wicked has staff that belong to the Air Force's only National Security Agency (NSA) certified red team and are cleared for TOP SECRET information and granted access to sensitive compartmented information based on single scope background investigation.

Our Technology

Bringing fiber-optic Internet to our community is huge challenge. With over 1,000 members of the Greek system already using our fiber-optic service online, Wicked Broadband's staff has proven that they are up to the technical challenge.

Step 1: Dig a hole

As with any network project that we've ever been involved with the first step is to dig a big hole.

In our case this hole will be occupied by underground conduit. This conduit will be installed by a local contractor who is paid a fair price.

At the same time they are installing conduit, our underground contractor will be setting hand-holes. These holes are used to join separate conduit runs and to house enclosures where the fiber-optic cable is spliced together.

Step 2: Pull the fiber

After the conduit is in place, our underground crew will pull a fiberoptic cable through from the nearest hand-hole to your home. In some cases this will be housed in conduit, in others it will be "direct-buried" using a vibra-trencher.



Step 3: Terminate the fiber

Once the fiber is pulled to your site, the next step is terminating it. Fiber is terminated inside of a 12" x 12" x 6" galvanized steel NEMA 3R rain tight enclosure.

Inside of the enclosure we place an optical networking terminal (ONT). The ONT is also water proof and protects the connectors on the end of the fiber (the ferrules) from dirt, debris and damage. To connect the fiber-optic cable to the ferrules in the ONT, our technicians use Wicked's state-of-the-art fusion splicer.

Expansion capacity

Notice that we are only using two (2) of the four (4) fibers that we are installing on each and every house. We actually only need one, but are using two because transceivers with both a send and receive fiber are less expensive than single fiber transceivers.

The result? We are installing enough capacity for other carriers to make use of it in the future. We are hoping that once we've built out the fiber network Google Fiber, or another provider, will make use of it to provide additional high-speed services in our community.

Unlike cable and phone providers who are moving mountains to keep competition out of the market, we believe that competition provides value for our customers and forces incumbents to innovate.

Step 3: Install the electronics

Rather than trying to re-invent the wheel, we've selected durable, time tested electronic components for our fiber demarcation points. Our eectronics package includes:

- Five port managed switch with SFP Cage for fiber transceiver
- Flexible power over Ethernet (POE)/solar charge controller
- 12V/5V voltage converter
- Five amp hour battery backup

This state of the art electronics package allows us to connect up to five devices at each site to our gigabit network core.

- Port 1 IPTV Segmented Network
- Port 2 1 Gbps Internet Access
- Port 3 Managed wireless access point
- Port 4 Spare (technician access)
- Port 5 Spare

Notice that once again we have included expansion capacity in our enclosure. This future proofs the installation and ensures that there will be a data port available for future technologies - like 3D holographic basketball coverage.

You might also notice that we are using port 3 to provide "managed wireless access". What's that?

Managed wireless

Managed wireless access is one of the features that we are bringing to our members that other ISPs simply don't have. By installing a managed access point on each home and connecting it to our battery backup we are able to provide our members with:

- 1. Access to the Internet in the event of a power outage or emergency
- 2. Access to public information resources without a paid account
- 3. Roaming WiFi access throughout the community

Managed Wireless Access

Step 4: Install your wall port

Unlike legacy technologies (cable and telephone), our infrastructure is designed for 21st century telecommunications. You don't need a special modem to translate between your router and our service. Plug in and get online. It is as simple as that.

We install a single wall plate on an exterior wall. If the member only has one desktop computer (some people still do!), they can simply plug into the port and get online.

Most families are going to want to install a router to share their connection among multiple devices. A router allows you to connect your laptop, cell phone, desktop, tablet, set-top box and game console to the Internet, all at the same time.

Step 5: Connect your devices

To get the most out of your Wicked Fiber connection, we recommend you upgrade your home router to one that supports a Gigabit connectivity. We recommend the Netgear N740 Wireless Dual Band Gigabit Router.

This \$119 router can be purchased from us, or directly from Amazon or another online retailer.

This router will allow all of your wireless devices to connect to the Internet using 802.11g, 802.11a, 802.11n and 802.11ac. That means legacy devices like old laptops can connect using 802.11g while you are simultaneously watching HD video on your Roku 3 using 802.11n.


The router also has advanced technologies like DLNA to share music and videos with your TV, wireless print sharing, wireless backups using Time Machine and a bunch of other features that are useful.

Most importantly, unlike older routers, it allows you to actually use the Gigabit service we are bringing to your home.

Connecting your Roku, Set Top Box or game console

Even though many modern TVs, game consoles and streaming media players have WiFi, you are going to get the best performance and lowest latency using wired technologies. That is why we recommend you connect your wired devices back to your router using ZyXEL PLA4211 HD Powerline Adapters.

These adapters cost around \$90 per pair and can be purchased from us, or directly from Amazon.


Quality of Service

Wicked Broadband uses a variety of technologies to ensure quality of service, including Cisco technologies such class-based weighted fair queuing, variable bit rate virtual circuits, pxf queuing and vlan tagging (for traffic segregation). The company also uses linux based systems to tag and filter traffic in memory at various different points of network consolidation.

Detailed discussion of the application of these technologies is proprietary. As can be seen in a number of the letters of reference and recommendation, however, the net effect of the company's application of bandwidth management is to provide most Wicked customers with access to substantially more bandwidth than they are actually paying for.

City of Lawrence Participation

To facilitate the project, Wicked has requested the following economic development incentives:

- 1. Waiver of first \$20K in franchise fees for 5 years. Wicked Broadband is currently the only ISP in Lawrence that pays a 5% franchise fee on its gross Internet revenue. The company would like to keep the first \$20K of these funds for the first 5 years of this project retroactive to the date the Wicked Fiber effort began (Q3, 2013)
 - Category: Tax Abatement
 - City Expenditure: \$0
- 2. Permission to co-locate splice cases in City hand holes. In places where Wicked fiber intersects City of Lawrence fiber, Wicked would like to keep its splice cases in the same hand hole as the City.
 - Category: Infrastructure
 - City Expenditure: \$0
- 3. Permission to splice into leased fiber under City supervision. Wicked has the skills and equipment necessary to do this work. Wicked can perform this work in house at a fraction of the cost of a contractor.
 - Category: Regulatory Change
 - City Expenditure: \$0
- 4. Thirty year leases of middle mile fiber. Wicked would like 12 count on each of the City's existing fiber runs, except where fiber is close to exhaustion. At those sites, Wicked would like a single fiber (i.e. from City Hall to the County Courthouse). When the City puts in new fiber for traffic or other purposes, Wicked would like for the City to include 24 fibers for Wicked's use.
 - Category: Infrastructure
 - City Expenditure: \$0
- 5. \$500K Infrastructure Grant & Loan Guarantee. Wicked would require a matching grant from the City in the amount of \$500K. The City will also be asked to underwrite Wicked's \$500K matching loan. This reduces the interest rate and extends the term of Wicked's financing.
 - a. Category: Loan/Grant
 - b. City Expenditure: \$500K

We are willing to discuss several variations of item five including a simple loan guarantee (i.e. eliminate the need for a grant), but to make it work we would need to develop an agreement in consultation with our lending partner, Emprise Bank.

Scope

The proposed network will be operated as a wholesale common carriage system. The installed capacity will be available to any retail provider for a fixed, publicly published price.

This is a very important distinction that differentiates our proposal from the typical FTTP proposal.

Under our proposal retailers will be encouraged to use the network to provide competing services to customers. Retailers will compete to provide the fastest, least expensive and highest quality service.

Since all retailers will have equal access to the infrastructure, this approach will eliminate the need to build duplicate overlapping networks. Competitors will no longer need to build and maintain expensive infrastructure in the rights of way. Since all of the fiber is owned and operated as a single system, the costs of building and maintaining the system will be spread amongst the providers. This will lower their costs of operation and allow them to lower prices for consumers.

Free market competition will encourage providers to innovate, cut costs and provide quality service. Consumers will win by getting faster service with better quality at lower prices.

Connectivity to each address on the network will be provided on four (4) separate fibers, meaning that each home can be served by multiple simultaneous providers.

Fiber will be provided to retail carriers "dark". Carriers will also have access to rack space and continuous power at the point of presence (POP) where the fibers from the individual homes are aggregated. Carriers will also be able to install the electronics of their choice on the homes of residents.

This approach makes it easy for multiple retailers to provide service at the same address. Each provider can access a single fiber, connect it to their equipment of choice and use the fiber to deliver whatever services customers demand.

Dark fiber will also be available to retailers to link each POP back to a central office (CO). The current location of the CO has not been selected, but it will likely be in the east Lawrence neighborhood selected for the pilot project. Several sites have indicated an interest in hosting the CO because makes the selected site very desirable to information technology companies that may want to access the fiber.

All in all this community driven, shared use approach benefits everyone. Regardless of what the community chooses to do to expand access to fiber, we encourage the City to select a proposal that is carrier neutral and promotes competition on a level playing field.

We also encourage the City to select a vendor with a proven track record of community service and a reputation for excellence. Wicked has been operating in Lawrence for 8 years now and has a proven track record of being able to develop and implement complex systems on tight budgets. We have been the driving force behind this process from the beginning and have proven our commitment to Lawrence over and over. The City will benefit greatly from partnering with us on this project.

I am one of the citizens here in Lawrence that pre-registered for Wicked Fiber. I believe in the project strongly enough to have paid \$10 to pre-register for service.

I believe that the fiber-optic project being proposed by Wicked Broadband is the type infrastructure project we should be supporting here in Lawrence. I would much rather see our economic development dollars spent building competitive broadband infrastructure than subsidizing private real estate projects like hotels and apartments.

Wicked Broadband has committed to operating the system under a common carrier arrangement that will allow multiple providers to use the same lines. This type of common carrier system will eventually allow residents of Lawrence to have a choice of providers. It will promote competition and encourage innovation.

Wicked Broadband is a locally owned, locally operated company and a good public citizen. They provide a free WiFi hotspot that extends from 6th St to 11th St in Downtown Lawrence, free service for dozens of individual low income families, and free service for local charities including Headquarters Counseling Center, the Homeless Shelter, Judah Worship Center, Ecumenical Christian Ministries, Just Food, O*Connell Youth Ranch and residents at the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority just to name a few.

Wicked Broadband is also the only local Internet provider that pays a 5% municipal franchise fee on Internet services. Neither AT&T nor Wide Open West Holdings, Llc pay this fee on Internet services. That amounts to millions of dollars in revenue being lost by the City as consumers move from subscription television and landlines to Internet TV and cellular phones.

I know that funding and building this network won't be easy. To build its network in Kansas City, KS Google needed subsidies like reduced attachment fees, access to existing fiber and free co-location in City facilities. In Provo, UT the City gave Google a \$40M fiber network as an incentive to provide service. Even little Baldwin City is issuing a local company \$5M in Industrial Revenue Bonds to build a fiber network just down the street.

Surely we can provide Wicked Broadband with a modest incentive to jumpstart their effort here.

I would much rather see our economic development dollars spent building competitive broadband infrastructure than subsidizing private real estate projects like hotels and apartments.

Wicked Broadband has committed to operating the system under a common carrier arrangement that will allow multiple providers to use the same lines. This type of common carrier system will eventually allow residents of Lawrence to have a choice of providers. It will promote competition and encourage innovation.

Wicked Broadband is a locally owned, locally operated company and a good public citizen. They provide a free WiFi hotspot that extends from 6th St to 11th St in Downtown Lawrence, free service for dozens of individual low income families, and free service for local charities including Headquarters Counseling Center, the Homeless Shelter, Judah Worship Center, Ecumenical Christian Ministries, Just Food, O'Connell Youth Ranch and residents at the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority just to name a few.

Wicked Broadband is also the only local Internet provider that pays a 5% municipal franchise fee on Internet services. Neither AT&T nor Wide Open West Holdings, Llc pay this fee on Internet services. That amounts to millions of dollars in revenue being lost by the City as consumers move from subscription television and landlines to Internet TV and cellular phones.

I know that funding and building this network won't be easy. To build its network in Kansas City, KS Google needed subsidies like reduced attachment fees, access to existing fiber and free co-location in City facilities. In Provo, UT the City gave Google a \$40M fiber network as an incentive to provide service. Even little Baldwin City is issuing a local company \$5M in Industrial Revenue Bonds to build a fiber network just down the street.

Surely we can provide Wicked Broadband with a modest incentive to jumpstart their effort here.

I have forwarded the City of Lawrence my \$10 refund check from Wicked to support our need for Gigabit fiber in our city. Please accept my offer and consider supporting this project.

At issue is not cost of ramping up the project or whether the city could subsidize a project for residents, it's about the increasing cost of broadband access for businesses and residents. Cable companies are consolidating and these companies own the pipes carrying the internet into a vast majority of our homes - it's not the telcos and it's not the content providers. These cable companies are already starting to meter and put limits on the networks. The fewer cable providers there are, the more unified the rate structure becomes.

I do not consume much television, thus I have not had a need to pay for cable television in over 6 years, but I pay about \$100/month for access to broadband internet in my home. Both my wife and I telework from home three or more days each week, and our internet and cell phone bills are not subsidized by the companies who employ us. We stream programming for television via PBS, Hulu, ESPN3, C-SPAN, Netflix, etc.; and I subscribe to the MLB and NBA networks each sporting season. Some of this programming is free; some of this programming I choose to subscribe to. The cost of pipe access is what is inflated, not the programming.

Dear Mr. Mayor,

I am one of the citizens here in Lawrence that pre-registered for Wicked Fiber. I believe in the project strongly enough to have paid \$10 to pre-register for service.

I believe that the fiber-optic project being proposed by Wicked Broadband is the type infrastructure project we should be supporting here in Lawrence. I would much rather see our economic development dollars spent building competitive broadband infrastructure than subsidizing private real estate projects like hotels and apartments.

Wicked Broadband has committed to operating the system under a common carrier arrangement that will allow multiple providers to use the same lines. This type of common carrier system will eventually allow residents of Lawrence to have a choice of providers. It will promote competition and encourage innovation.

Wicked Broadband is a locally owned, locally operated company and a good public citizen. They provide a free WiFi hotspot that extends from 6th St to 11th St in Downtown Lawrence, free service for dozens of individual low income families, and free service for local charities including Headquarters Counseling Center, the Homeless Shelter, Judah Worship Center. Ecumenical Christian Ministries, Just Food, O'Connell Youth Ranch and residents at the Lawrence-Douglas County Housing Authority just to name a few.

Wicked Broadband is also the only local Internet provider that pays a 5% municipal franchise fee on Internet services. Neither AT&T nor Wide Open West Holdings, Llc pay this fee on Internet services. That amounts to millions of dollars in revenue being lost by the City as consumers move from subscription television and landlines to Internet TV and cellular phones.

I know that funding and building this network won't be easy. To build its network in Kansas City, KS Google needed subsidies like reduced attachment fees, access to existing fiber and free co-location in City facilities. In Provo, UT the City gave Google a \$40M fiber network as an incentive to provide service. Even little Baldwin City is issuing a local company \$5M in Industrial Revenue Bonds to build a fiber network just down the street.

Surely we can provide Wicked Broadband with a modest incentive to jumpstart their effort here.

We are writing as residents of Lawrence to urge the City of Lawrence to support the project proposed by Wicked Fiber to bring fiber internet service to our city.

High-speed internet is the infrastructure that will drive the next 50 years of economic growth in America. Just as the City supports essential economic infrastructure, such as roads, sewers, and water that benefit all her citizens, fiber internet will likewise benefit all the citizens of Lawrence, but, like any major infrastructure project, it requires a partnership between the City and private business. Wicked Fiber has stepped forward to start building this network, and has pledged to make the fiber network open and available to other companies wishing to offer service — thereby laying groundwork for more investment by other companies and creating a competitive environment for valuable information resources

As can already be seen with Google Fiber in the Kansas City metro, fiber internet drives business growth and entrepreneurship. The "brain drain" to Kansas City is a continuing problem only exacerbated by the growing disparity in broadband internet.

Existing "lower speed" internet does not provide the capability for high-quality multi-point teleconferencing, file sharing, remote presence and collaboration that modern business requires.

Most importantly, we believe the talent and the resources to do this project should come directly from Lawrence. Our community should work towards self-sufficiency rather than bring in outside companies that will divert profits and growth outside the community.

Lawrence must not allow itself to be left behind, in the manner of a 19th century town choosing to be bypassed by the railroad. Please provide financial and administrative support to Wicked Fiber's proposed project and ensure that the essential infrastructure of the 21st century does not pass our city by.
