

The City of Lawrence participated in a Public Protection Classification survey conducted by the Insurance Services Office (ISO) from December 14 through

ISO collects and evaluates information from communities in the United States on their structure fire suppression capabilities. The data is analyzed using a Fire Suppression Rating Schedule (FSRS) and then a Public Protections Classification (PPC) number is assigned to the community. The surveys are conducted whenever it appears that there is a possibility of classification change. As such, the PPC program provides important, up to date information about fire protection service throughout the country.


The City was notified that it had maintained its PPC of 2 on July 27, 2011. It should be noted that there are only 592 Class 2 departments in the United States and 7 within Kansas



Employee safety is priority one; this program helped provide safety considerations through interactive scenarios and group discussions. managers are better prepared to help remove or reduce injuries on the emergency scene and in training




No. of Responses by Unit ■ Medical ■ Fire
