Lawrence Parks and Recreation Department is a Finalist for National Gold Medal Award

The American Academy for Park and Recreation Administration in partnership with the National Recreation and Park Association has named Lawrence Parks and Recreation Department as a finalist for the 2018 National Gold Medal Awards for Excellence in Park and Recreation Management.

Founded in 1965, the Gold Medal Awards program honors communities in the U.S. that demonstrate excellence in parks and recreation through long-



range planning, resource management, volunteerism, environmental stewardship, program development, professional development and agency recognition. Applications are separated into seven classes, with five classes based on population, one class for armed forces and one class for state park systems awarded on odd numbered years.

Lawrence Parks and Recreation is a finalist in the Class III category. This is the fourth time Lawrence Parks and Recreation has been a finalist. The other three years were 1997, 1998 and 2015.

Agencies are judged on their ability to address the needs of those they serve through the collective energies of citizens, staff and elected officials. Lawrence joins three other agencies in its class that will compete for grand honors this year. Those agencies are: Bloomington (Ind.) Parks and Recreation Department, City of Evanston (III.), Parks and Recreation and Community Services and Greeley (Colo.) Culture, Parks and Recreation.

A panel of five park and recreation professionals reviews and judges all application materials. Judges are chosen for their considerable experience and knowledge in parks and recreation on both the local and national levels.

This year's finalists will compete for Grand Plaque Award honors this summer, and the seven Grand Plaque recipients will be announced live during the Opening General Session at the 2018 NRPA Annual Conference in Indianapolis, Ind., Tuesday-Thursday, Sept. 25-27. Strategic Plan

Green Bonds

It has been a year since the City of Lawrence issued the first Green Bonds in Kansas, and the benefits are already starting to pay off. Local governments issue bonds to finance large projects, and Green Bonds exclusively finance projects that address key areas of environmental concern like climate



change, natural resource conservation, and pollution reduction. Lawrence's Green Bonds financed a wide variety of high impact energy efficiency and environmental improvement projects for various City facilities, which directly reduce energy use, greenhouse gas emissions, and save tax dollars. These projects are estimated to save 3,201 tons of CO2e annually, which is equivalent to the avoidance of burning 3,502,188 pounds of coal. Governing Magazine featured Lawrence in the July cover story "The New Gold Rush for Green Bonds- Investors are lining up to buy them to fund environmental projects."
