The City of Lawrence is requesting \$1,100,000 for stormwater improvements at the intersection of 23<sup>rd</sup> Street and Ousdahl Road. This area is a major stormwater challenge during large rain events, seriously impeding traffic on one of the busiest east-west arterials in Lawrence, and affecting commerce. The ability for emergency vehicles to travel and access this area is also impaired. Once funding is obtained, this project could be completed in one construction season.

The City of Lawrence has previously received \$800,000 in the 2006 Appropriations Bill for the improvement of 31<sup>st</sup> Street from Haskell to O'Connell.

## **Important: Cost Share Requirement:**

There is a 45% cost share requirement for any portion of a project funded through a STAG infrastructure grant. In almost all cases, other federal funds can not be used to fund this 45% cost share. For example, a \$1 million project could receive a maximum of \$550,000 from the Federal government, with the remaining \$450,000 the responsibility of the grantee. Ability to fund the 45% cost share is required before EPA can award a STAG grant. Please make your constituents

aware of this cost share requirement. Submission of this request does not constitute a commitment to fund this specific project, nor is it a commitment to provide full Federal funding for the 55% of the specific project cost.

The Committee limits STAG infrastructure grants to some of the project types eligible for Clean Water and Drinking Water State Revolving Fund (SRF) loans.
