It's beginning to look a lot like colder weather. Staff met last week to update the snow clearance plan that encourages facility access and participation throughout the season. We have also been hard at work preparing for the annual holiday lighting event. And our recreational programs for spring/summer have been finalized and will be open for registration online November 24.

### Parks

- Holiday Lights installation has begun (lighting to take place November 29<sup>th</sup>)
- All Parks prepare equipment and reestablish routing for snow removal
- Park Hill playground installation is complete (ribbon cutting in near future)
- Holcom Park Complex work in process on dugouts and apron improvements
- East Lawrence Center replacement of restroom sinks is in progress
- Water Tower Park working with MSO staff to plan location for a new water tower
- Golf Course working to reseed 3 greens on the front nine to new variety of grass
- Clinton Lake Softball Complex working on erosions control project between fields
- Forestry continued removal of dead and dying right -of-way trees
- Sports Pavilion repairs to multiple HVAC units
- Working with KDOT on short-term design solutions for intersection of K10 and 27<sup>th</sup> street
- SLT trail improve drainage to help keep water off one of the sections of trail
- Lawrence Loop trail working with MSO staff on design process for section from 11<sup>th</sup> to 7<sup>th</sup> streets and conceptual ideas for the section from 7<sup>th</sup> street to Constant Park
