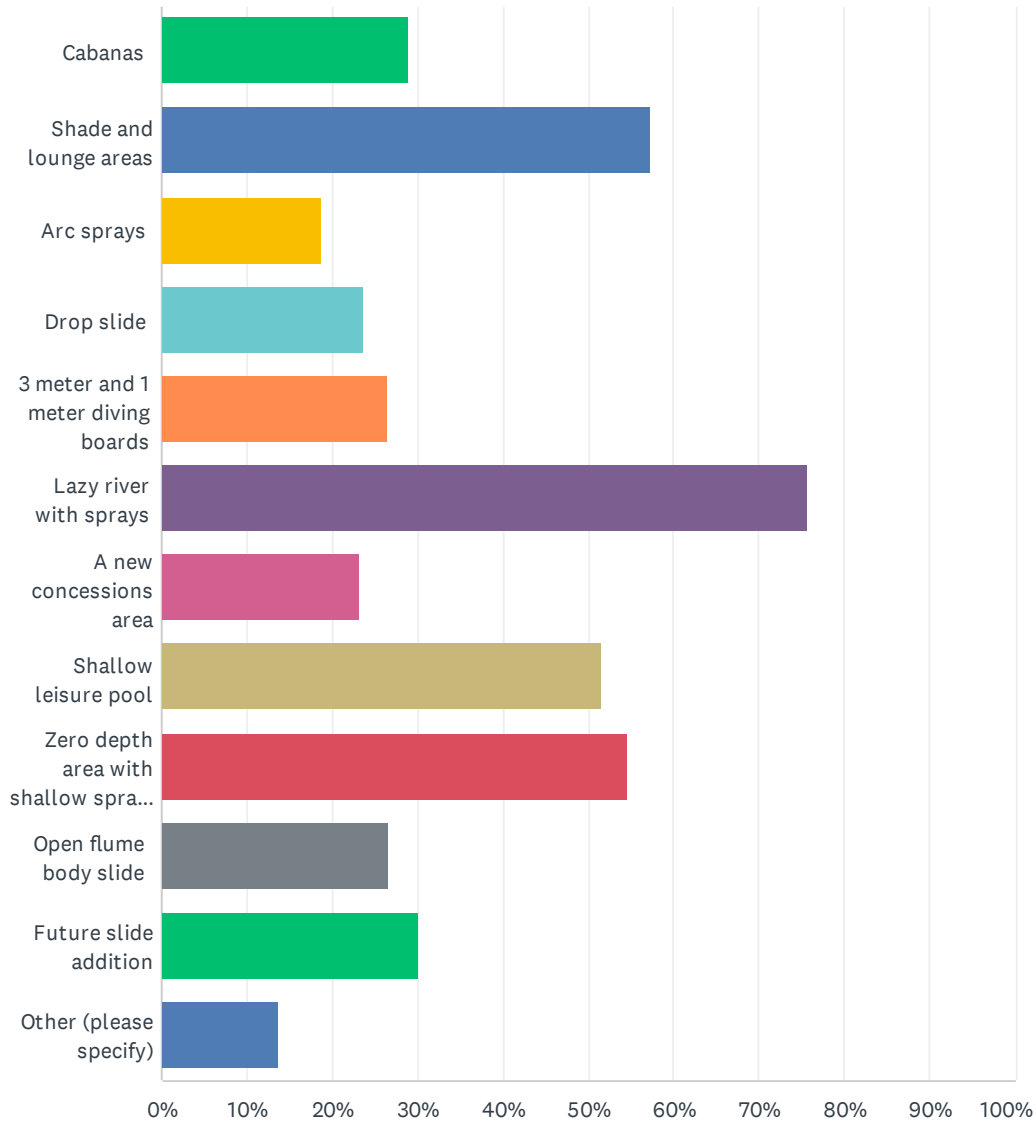


Q1 What features of the preferred concept (Big Variety) do you like most? Select all that apply.

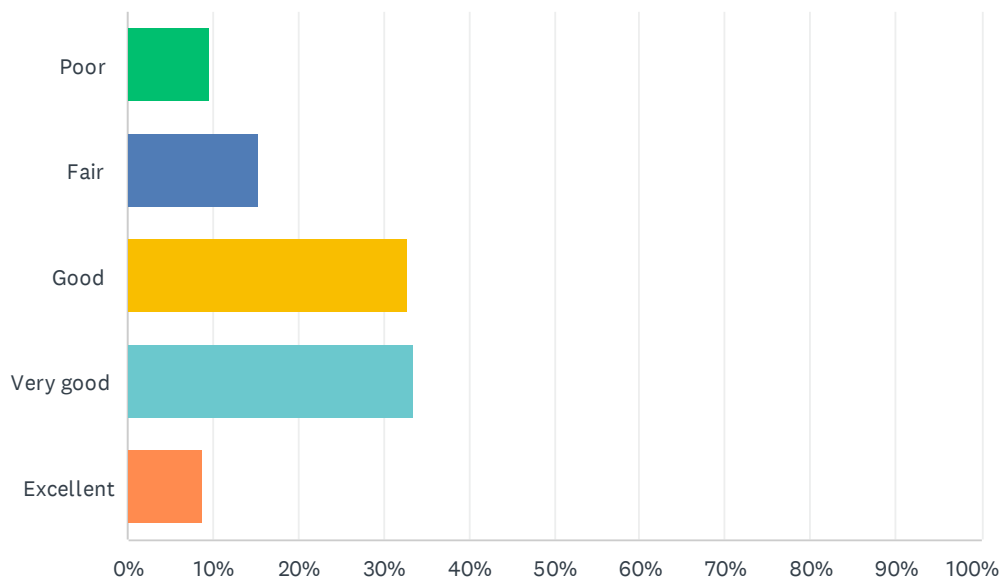

There does not appear to be anywhere on the survey to provide overall feedback, but the primary issue that must get solved before any of this work is explored is the hours/staffing issues at the pool. It seems misguided to seriously explore these new initiatives without first solving the major issues surrounding the daily hours of operation and the length of the overall season. Simply put, the pool needs to open for the season earlier (Memorial Day) and close later (Labor Day). Daily hours need to be greatly expanded. The current issues are primarily due to staffing shortages, correct? If so, solve that issue, expand daily hours and the overall season and provide much better accessibility for the community. 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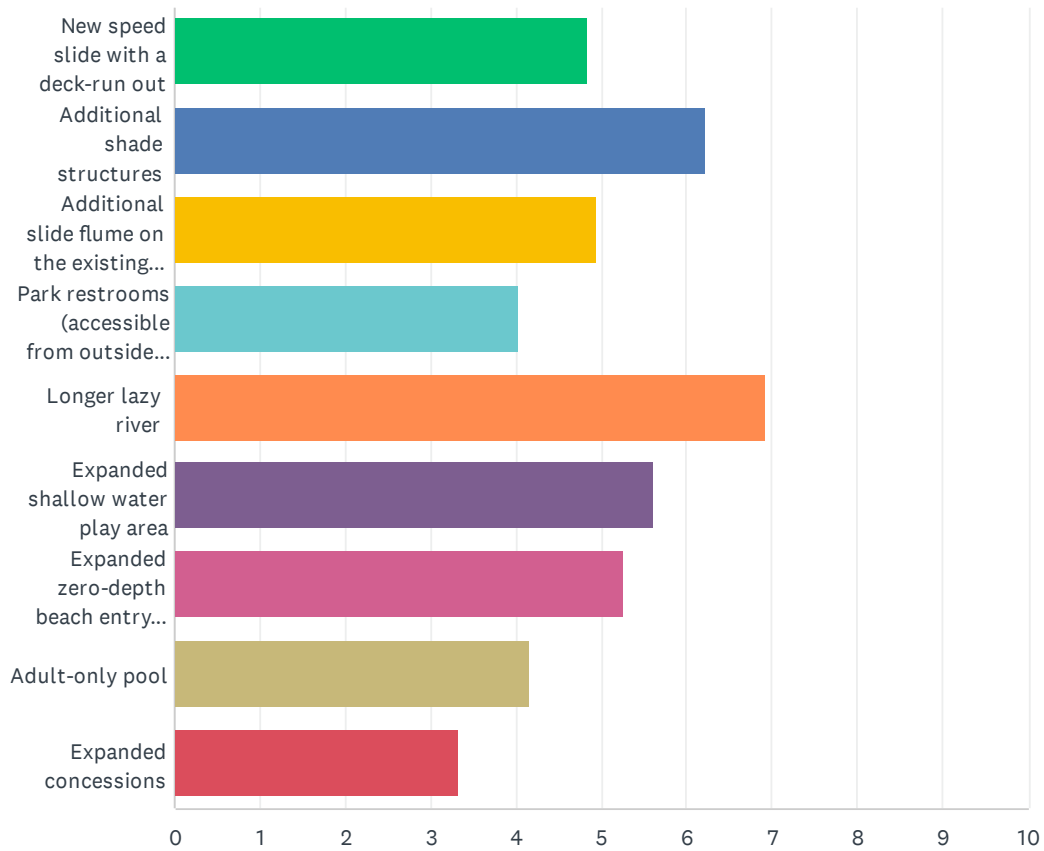

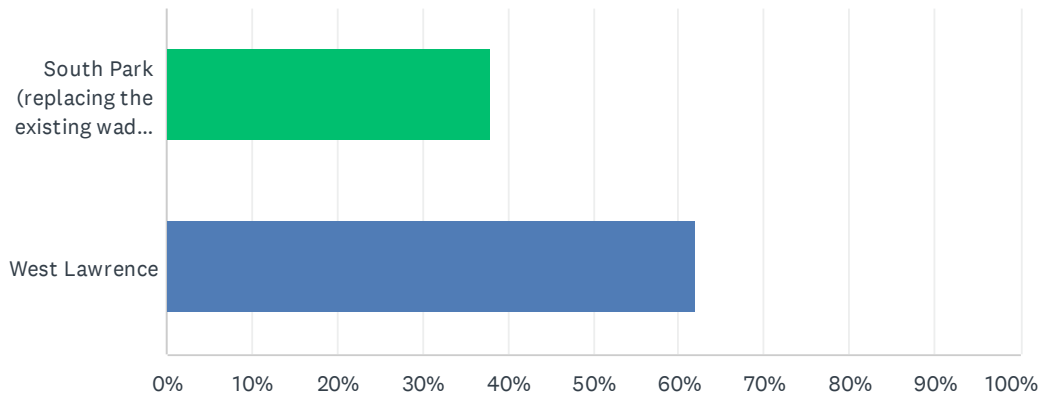

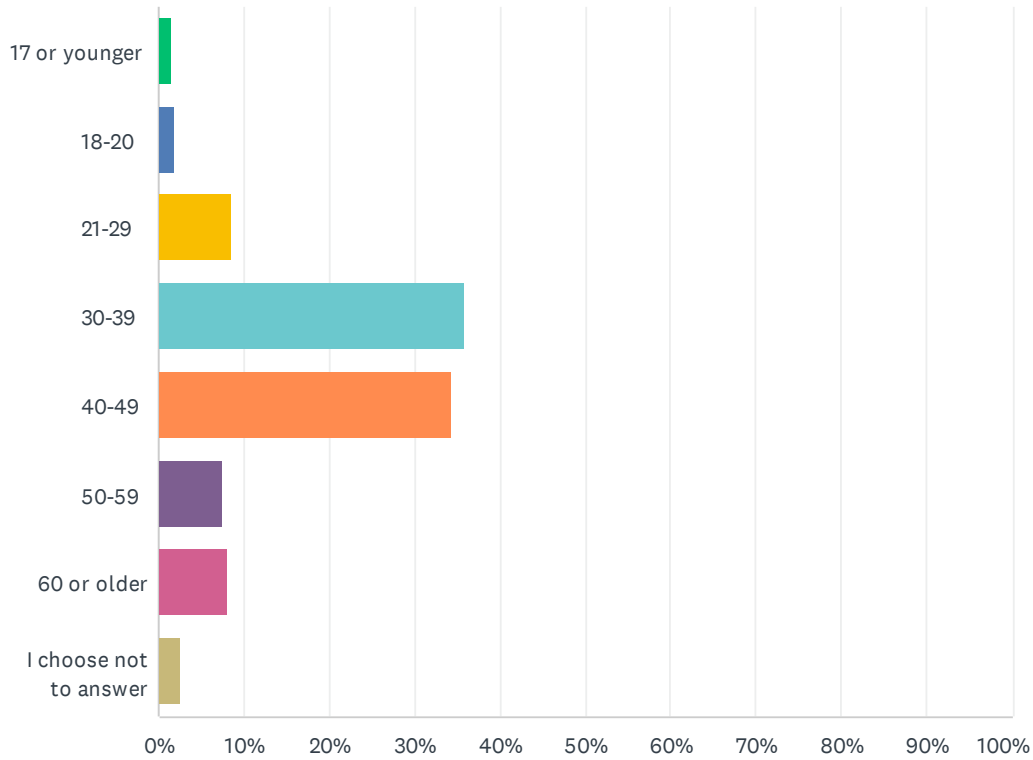

Q6 What category below includes your age?

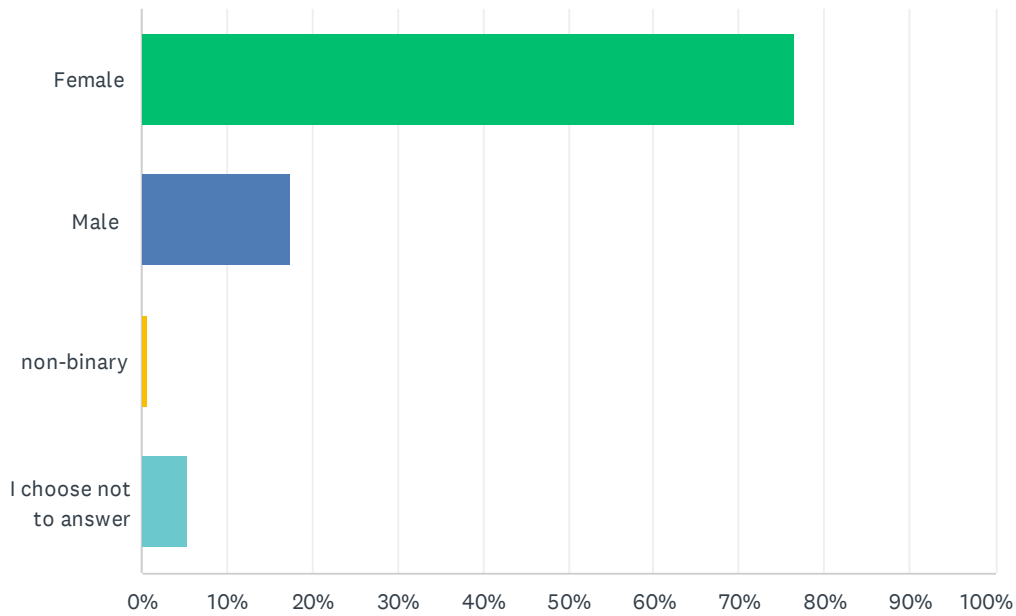

Q7 With what gender do you identify most?

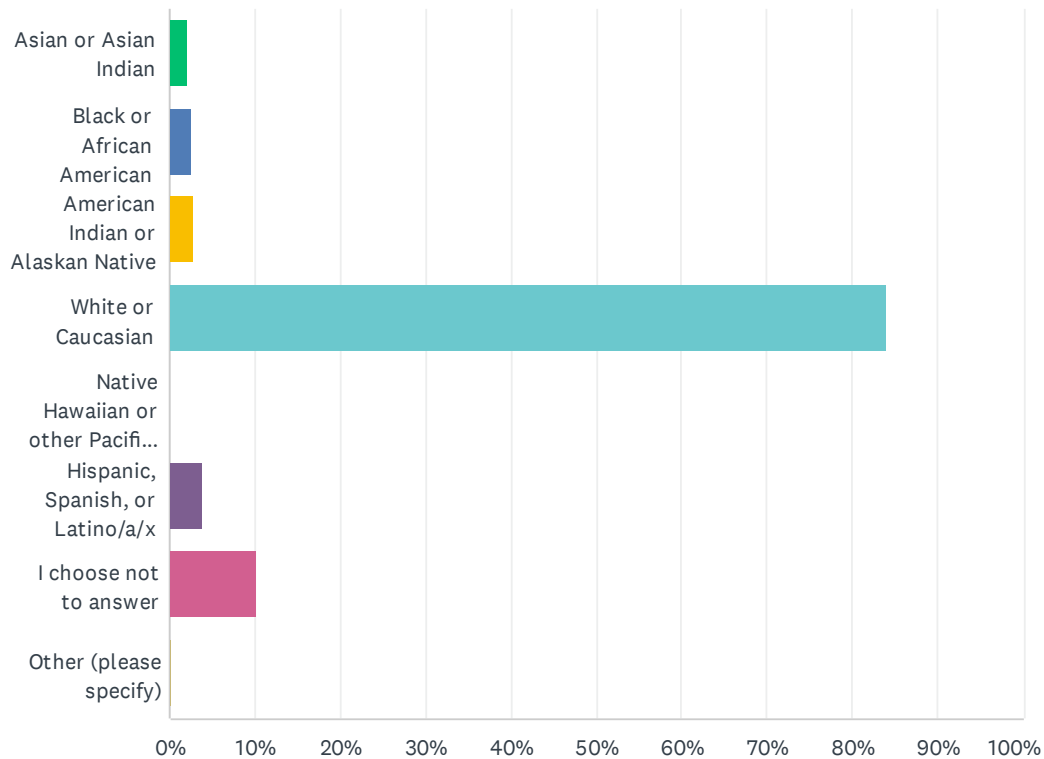

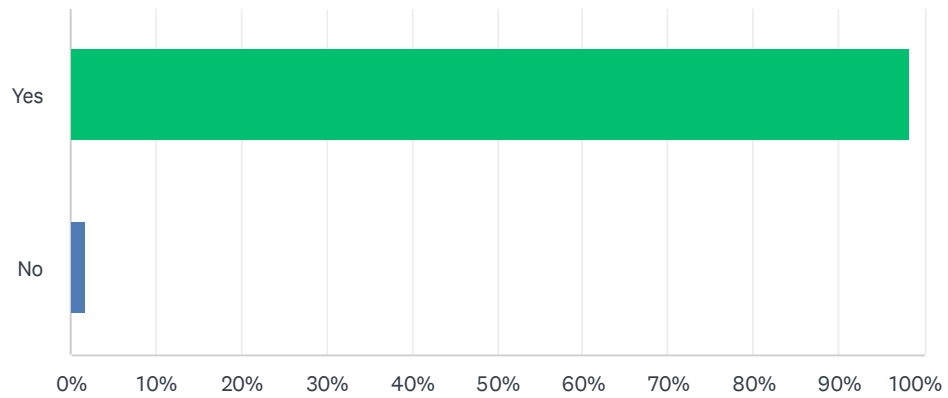

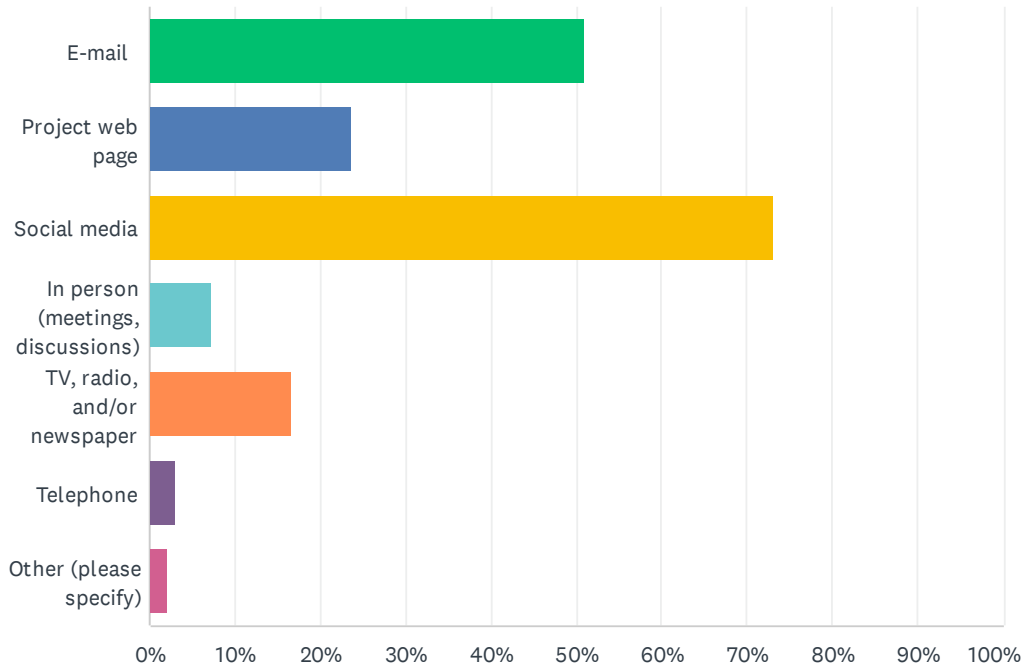
