Lawrence Parks and Recreation Master Plan Summary of Youth Survey Results

Overview of the Methodology

The City of Lawrence Department of Parks and Recreation administered a survey to students at Lawrence schools during the fall of 1999 to help determine parks and recreation priorities for the community. The surveys were distributed to 373 randomly selected students in grades 3-12 at 27 Lawrence schools. The results for the random sample of 373 students have a 95% level of confidence with a precision of at least +/- 5.2%.

Major Findings


Programs: Awareness, Participation, and Priorities

- 68% of the youth surveyed indicated that there is a City park within walking distance of their home; 31% indicated that they use the park near their home at least one a week. More than half (56%) of those surveyed indicated that they use the park closest to their home at least once per month; 71% of those surveyed indicated that they use other parks in the City of Lawrence in addition to the one nearest their home.
- 59% of the youth surveyed indicated that they use the City's recreation centers. Of those who use recreation centers, 52% indicated that they use them at least once per month; 27% indicated that they use them at least once per week.
- The <u>indoor recreational activities</u> that youth were most interested in based on the percentage of "very interested" responses were: indoor swimming (57%), video games/arcade games (56%), indoor basketball (45%), and billiards/pool (42%).
- The <u>natural oriented recreation programs</u> that youth were most interested in based on the percentage of "very interested" responses were: canoeing/boating (47%), exploring/playing in the woods (46%), and trail walking/hiking (43%).
- The <u>outdoor recreational activities</u> that youth were most interested in based on the percentage of "very interested" responses were: concerts/entertainment (56%), bicycle riding in their neighborhood (46%), outdoor basketball (46%), bicycle trail riding (45%), baseball (40%), soccer (40%), and in-line skating (40%).

Is There a Park Near Your Home That You Can Walk To?


by percentage of youth respondents






How Often Do You Use the Park Near Your Home?


by percentage of youth respondents who indicated there was a park near their home





















What Do You Do At City Recreation Centers?


by percentage of youth respondents who indicated that they use City recreation centers






