LPRD Facility Access Card Update



Anyone visiting a Lawrence Parks and Recreation facility **MUST** have a valid access card.

Who needs one?

Access cards are required for everyone 10 years-old and older entering any Parks and Recreation facility*.

Children under 10 years-old **must** be accompanied by an LPRD access card holder to enter and use any Parks and Recreation facility unless enrolled and participating in an LPRD program.

Access cards for Sports Pavilion Lawrence[®] will work for all facilities and those already in posession of one **do not need** a new card.

How do I get one?

Access cards are available at all Parks and Recreation facilities. Those who have taken classes, rented facilities or conducted other business with LPRD will have an account on file. Those who don't have an account will need to set one up at the front counter.

Parents will need to include the names of all children applying for a card and give a signature for parental consent.

How much does it cost?

Access cards are **free** to all Douglas County residents with proof of residency, such as: driver's license, state-issued ID, current home owners insurance policy, property tax statement, vehicle registration, mail from university, mortgage or lease document from Lawrence or Douglas County.

Out-of-county residents can purchase an access card with a year's access for \$65 or pay a daily admission fee of \$5 per day.

There is a **\$5 replacement fee** for all lost or stolen cards.

*Those participating in a program, renting a facility or attending an aquatics facility will not require an access card.
