Geocaching Regulations

Geocaching is a regulated activity within the Lawrence Parks & Recreation Department. In order to protect sensitive park areas, all people wishing to place a geocache within a City of Lawrence park must receive a permit and follow the regulations as stated below.

- 1. Participants must comply with all Geocaching and Lawrence Parks & Recreation Department Guidelines. Visit www.geocaching.com and www.lprd.org to review guidelines.
- 2. Participants must comply with all general Lawrence Parks & Recreation Department Rules and Regulations.
- 3. Before a cache is placed in a park, a permit must be obtained from the Lawrence Parks & Recreation Department. There is no charge for this permit. See the Geocaching Placement Site Permit Application for required information.
- 4. Due to sensitive areas of the park, the location of the cache is subject to the approval of the park superintendent. Upon the receipt of the permit application, the cache location(s) can either be approved or disapproved, or require modification to the location of the cache. Upon approval, the cache can then be placed. At any time, the superintendent can ask that the cache be moved or removed.
- 5. Caches can remain in place from the date a permit is issued until April 15 of the next year. After that date, the cache must be removed or re-permitted. This is done to protect areas from foot traffic. If the caches are moved, removed, or re-permitted during this period, the Parks and Recreation Department must be notified.
- 6. Cache locations must be naturally occurring hiding spots. There can be no trees cut, pruned or have things attached to them with nails, screws or other fasteners; holes dug; vegetation removed, trimmed, or planted. No caches can be placed in birdhouses, nests, or in animal dens.
- 7. Due to programs and special studies being conducted, all caches placed at Prairie Park Nature Center must obtain prior permission from the Supervising Interpreter at that location before seeking final approval.
- 8. Due to safety concerns, no caches will be allowed to be placed at Eagle Bend Golf Course.
- 9. Containers must be clearly marked "GEOCACHE PLEASE DON'T THROW AWAY" Do not use ammo boxes, PVC pipes or other containers that might cause alarm.
- 10. Offensive, illegal or dangerous items are not allowed in any cache.
- 11. Caches placed to promote commercial, political, religious or other social agendas are also not allowed.
- 12. The following statement shall be included on the geocaching.com web page:
