**Neighborhood events:**

None this quarter, although work is in progress about the spring cleanup and annual picnic.

**Neighborhood projects:**

The Journal-World reported on a home (500 Missouri) in the Pinckney neighborhood that was being designated for use by homeless individuals with mental illness. After the Neighborhood's recent negative experience with Project Acceptance and Acceptance House, there was a great deal of concern by this unexpected announcement.

This issue was raised at the January 19<sup>th</sup> meeting. Plus several concerned neighbors contacted the PNA President outside of any formal meetings asking the PNA help in finding out what this program was and to help get more information

After the January meeting, the PNA President contacted the people involved with the 500 Missouri project (Five Loaves Ministry, Steve Ozark), sent out many emails and then invited the people involved with the project to the February meeting.

Much time was spent on gathering details, determining the pros and cons of the project, talking to various city officials as well as project sponsors. The issue was discussed in the PNA newsletter, resulting in a Five Loaves Ministry February 16 public meeting at the library as well as discussed at the well-attended February 16 PNA meeting.

These discussions led to a much better understanding of the proposal as well as Pinckney residents feeling more comfortable about the project.

We had a discussion about what is our overall mission? Some of the thoughts were:

- Help maintain integrity of neighborhood. Pinckney is very diverse
- Helps create and maintain lines of communication among all neighbors, including low-income.
- We can leverage various neighborhood efforts with volunteers.

It was suggested that we might want to look at safety issues, e.g. kids walking to school, safe homes.

Jeanette announced she was probably going to be dropping her seat on the Neighborhood Resources Advisory Committee and that Pinckney may need a new representative.

We were asked what information we had about the project at 500 Missouri Street. According to the paper, there's a plan to house homeless individuals there and neighbors in the area are concerned.
