Anecdotal Documentation of Partnerships, Special Programs or Good Neighboring Stories:

- We were joined at our September meeting by Michelle Leininger of the Lawrence Planning Department. Michelle talked with us about zoning in our neighborhood, current planning, codes, and zoning issues in the City, and answered our questions about City Planning.
- Brian Jimenez, Code Enforcement Manager for Lawrence was our speaker at the October meeting. Brian discussed how the City deals with neighborhood issues such as blight, nuisance, and sidewalk snow removal. He also explained some of the newer and impending regulations regarding rentals and higher density housing.
- It was a great showing for PNA's first ever Trunk-or-Treat and Just Food Drive event for Halloween. The weather cooperated and everyone who attended had a great time. Attendees indicated they would love to participate again next year and will tell their friends. Lawrence Memorial Hospital, located centrally in the neighborhood, granted us use of their large staff parking lot for the event. Everyone also indicated it was a wonderful opportunity to meet additional people in the neighborhood. Some of the highlights included:
 - 14 trunk/booth entries, including the many decorated trunks handing out candy or other food items, several games, and the Douglas County Dental Clinic.
 - 130 lbs of food collected and donated to Just Food Douglas County.
 - Local businesses donated certificates and prizes for best costume in many age groups, best game and best trunk/booth.
 - Several students from Free State High School volunteered to assist with running booths, setting up, managing the event, and cleaning up afterwards.
- PNA's Facebook group continues to grow. We are up to 52 members now.

Lawrence Elementary School Consolidation Planning

Earlier this year, the Lawrence Board of Education created the Central and East Elementary School Consolidation Working Group (Working Group) to “recommend a community plan for reducing the six elementary schools of Sunset Hill, Hillcrest, Pinckney, Cordley, Kennedy and New York to four or three schools within the next two or three years.” In June, Superintendent Rick Doll appointed members of the Working Group, including five members representing Pinckney School, one of whom is a teacher from Pinckney that serves as a non-voting member.

The Working Group is charged with considering the schools’ unique educational and social communities to determine which schools are most appropriate for consolidation based upon the criteria set out in the Board’s Vision Statement for Elementary School Facilities and the Task Force’s report. Two initial teams have been formed to focus on 1) the central schools, Hillcrest and Sunset Hills, and 2) the eastern schools, Cordley, Kennedy and New York. Representatives from Pinckney and Woodlawn will be split between the two initial teams. The Working Group is charged with completing its work by February 2012.

The Working Group held its first planning meeting in June. The remaining meetings are scheduled for: September 7 and 19, October 3 and 17, November 7 and 21, December 5 and 19, January 2, 16 and 30. All meetings will be held from 7 to 9 p.m. at the district office.

Upcoming Speakers and Issues to be discussed at Monthly PNA Meetings

Michelle Leininger from the City of Lawrence Public Planning Department will join us on Saturday September 17th to discuss many issues important to the Pinckney Neighborhood. Some issues likely to be discussed include a recent proposal to add 75 cents to each water bill to create a fund to maintain sidewalks in the City. Other topics may be the planning process called “complete streets” and infrastructure needs within the neighborhood.

We plan to invite Brian Jimenez from the Lawrence City Code Enforcement Department on October 15th for his annual update on issues pertinent the Neighborhood. We will also attend to the final plans for the Trunk-or-Treat & Just Food Drive.

On November 19th we hope to have David Johnson, CEO of Bert Nash Community Health Center, visit with us to discuss Bert Nash’s plans to expand their facility as well as the services provided by Bert Nash to families and the community. We also invite local historians and those interested in Pinckney history to join us for the Focus Session on November 19th (starting at about 11:00) to initiate a Pinckney Neighborhood history collaboration project. We hope to create a repository of Pinckney history that will be viewable on the internet with information about Pinckney’s important and interesting past and present.

So you ask, what is Trunk-or-Treat? The simple answer is that it's a lot of fun. The detailed answer is that fun loving people decorate the trunks of cars, beds of trucks, backs of vans, a table, a tent, a booth (you name it, really) in the Halloween spirit for kids (of all ages) to visit and enjoy. You might choose to pass out candy, food or drinks (e.g., cider), or have games of skill, silly entertainment or any other Halloween or carnival like activity.
