Anecdotal Documentation of Partnerships, Special Programs or Good Neighboring Stories:

- We continued our efforts in support of the Sandra Shaw Nature Trail which is proposed for part of the former VFW property, including sending a letter of support on behalf of the neighborhood. Stakeholders and interested parties include: City Commission, Lawrence Parks and Recreation Department, Bert Nash, John McGrew representing Outside for a Better Inside advocacy group, Douglas County Health Department.
- At our January meeting, Jerry Coatney of Liberty Tax Service spoke with us about changes in the tax laws this year that would likely affect low- and moderate-income residents of our neighborhood. Jerry has been a consistent sponsor of Pinckney events and we were pleased that he also volunteered to share his professional expertise with us.
- Pinckney Neighborhood Association and Old West Lawrence Neighborhood Association are two donors for the Pinckney Tunnel project. A large number of neighborhood residents and Pinckney PTO member families attended a fundraising bluegrass concert (entertainment provided by our neighborhood's own Truckstop Honeymoon). This effort brings together the best of our neighborhoods to rehabilitate the tunnel under 6th street which links us.
