#### **GUEST SPEAKER**

• Paul Baumchen gave a presentation on the Emerald Ash borer and mosquito control:

**Emerald Ash Borer**: Twenty million Emerald Ash trees have been killed in 34 states. Lawrence has the Emerald Ash Borer. Currently, the city's process is to inventory, evaluate, treat as possible, remove and replant with a different species. There are approximately 3,000 trees in the right-of-way in Lawrence. They will treat approximately 350. The trees they can treat are 8"-22" in diameter. If your property abuts the right-of-way and a tree needs to be removed or treated, a packet of information will be left with the homeowner. He brought samples of tree damage and of the borer. Wood that has been infected should be quarantined. High heat can kill the pest. If you have Emerald Ash trees in your yard, be sure to use a licensed arborist for treatment or removal.

**Mosquitos**: The city and the county are not planning for any mosquito control. **P. Miller** to author a letter to both commissions regarding our health concerns and the potential financial loss to the city when Burcham Park is not usable due to mosquitos. We may be able to include KU Rowing team and recent Community Fest organizers as letter signers. We will note mosquito control as we develop our neighborhood plan. Use the 3 Ds around your home: drain standing water, dress in long sleeves/pants, and defend using insect repellent.

A motion to adjourn was made by P. Jefferson; B. Sufian seconded. Voice vote. Motion carries. Meeting adjourned at 11:40 a.m.
