I had an opportunity to meet with the Mayor of Lawrence along with the presidents of 2 other neighborhood assoications. I feel that it was productive as the City now a does a better job of communicating to neighborhoods about upcoming projects.

Both LMH and Habitat for Humanity have reached for input on their proceedings in the neighborhood. I feel that's a positive statement on the value and role of the association.

County Commissoner Patrick Kelly reached out as well. Hopefully in future, we can have him come in to talk about county initiatives affecting Pinckney.

I feel that the 4th of July celebration in Burcham Park was another sucess this year (even with the rain). We have improved on some aspects from last year and Mike Logan was gracious enough to allow us to participate this year and raise some money for PNA. It was a good start this year but we hope to increase it in years to come.

Lawrence Memorial Hospital has let us know about a potential parking lot expansion. Specifically, they were contemplating constructing a parking garage on a portion of the land contaning Woody Park. There were preliminary discussions regarding the project but I felt the neighborhood as whole would benefit if LMH made themselves available for question and answer session. We were able to get a firm commitment for LMH, CEO Russ Johnson to attend our August meeting along with any pertinent staff. We hope to have a long-term solution regarding parking as the piecemeal approach is proving to be ineffective.

Additionally, Vice Principal Timothy Leffert (Liberty Memorial Central Middle School) will be speaking at the August meeting. It should insightful for Pinckney parents to learn more their middle school.

We had our initial meeting with Community Health Plan Steering Committee. I feel that this could be a valuable resource to the community concerning equity and wellness. I look forward to the exciting initiatives that will come forth from this endeavor.
