A door hanger with communication information for the school was handed out. PNA invited the school to get involved in the Trunk or Treat and the Summer Picnic (info to be given to Joshua Spradlin, Student Council for follow up); the School needs help with covering yearbook costs for students who cannot afford to purchase (potential funding opportunity for PNA).

Russ Johnson, CEO, LMH - There is the potential to move Woody Park to an area in Sandra J. Shaw, improve the field and the green space where Woody is now situated, and establish a visible memorial to honor Mr. Woody. Executing this idea is not urgent; LMH has not identified a specific purpose for the area where Woody Park is located; the neighborhood is considered a partner and will be involved in decision-making; parking needs will not be definitely known until the west campus of LMH is operational in 2020 and some hospital services move there.

Mr. Woody's grandson spoke about the origins of the park, originally Lincoln Park in the 1930s and renamed Woody Park in 1970, and the only facility that black baseball players could use. He wants to honor the legacy of his grandfather with a memorial, would like community green space, such as a community garden, the creation of a green roof if there is a parking structure, etc.

PNA desires a comprehensive vision for the hospital corridor with all parties involved in discussions: city, county, LMH, PNA, Bert Nash, etc. and made a motion to request a study. *Motion: PNA -- in coordination with the city, county and other organizations in the neighborhood -- requests a comprehensive study of the area surrounding the hospital (6th to 2nd & Maine) that will identify potential growth and usage and the necessary resources to manage that growth in the neighborhood.* [Utilities, parking, stormwater management, traffic, sidewalks, lighting, etc.]

Motion by Pat Miller; 2nd by Mike Shaw. Voice-Vote. Motion Carries.

R. Johnson and S. Plinsky to reach out to the city to begin the process.

Treasurer's Report
