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ASSESSMENT OF ISSUES AND OPPORTUNITIES FOR THE K-10 & FARMER'S TURNPIKE PLAN

As part of the planning process for long-range plans, input from interested parties is sought throughout the development of the plan. This is the first opportunity for public input regarding the *K-10 & Farmer's Turnpike Plan*. Stakeholder input is critical for a successful plan.

Issues

- Importance of planning for the I-70/K-10 interchange
 - Truck route through area
 - Potential industrial/employment center node with proper planning
- Connection to urbanized area southeast of the planning area
- Importance of arterial street access (Farmer's Turnpike)
- Availability of park space
- Plan before development
- Rural character vs. suburban/urban character
- Range of topography (minimal slope to steep slopes)
 - Supports a mix of uses
 - Offers natural buffers
- Consideration of leap-frog development (not contiguous to existing city limits)
 - Delivery of urban services (a need to prepare long-range service facility planning documents for planning area)
 - Efficiency of services when not contiguous to city limits (water, wastewater, fire/medical, police, trash, etc.)



- Consideration of planning within two school districts
- Viewsheds (a fixed vantage point where scenic environmental elements are visible)
- Review of urban growth area (portion of planning area located outside UGA)
- Consideration of City of Lecompton issues (within 3 miles of Lecompton)

Opportunities

- Significant employment potential for the region
- Develop an important gateway/entry way to Lawrence
- Develop with mixed uses and densities that respect natural elements
- Expand recreational trails system and park facilities
- Integrate protection of sensitive lands with future development
